

~PRONOUNCEMENT (132)

[English, statement, assertion, declaration, announcement, decree, verdict, proclamation]

- Yehowah God himself lifted up a **pronouncement** against Ahab.
- He now said to Bidkar his adjutant; Lift him up, throw him into the tract of the field of Naboth the Jezreelite, for remember. I and you were riding teams behind Ahab his father, and Yehowah himself lifted up this **pronouncement** against him. (2 Kings 9:25)
- As for his sons and the abundance of the **pronouncement** against him and the founding of the house of the true God, there they are written in the exposition of the Book of the Kings. And Amaziah his son began to reign in place of him. (2 Chronicles 24:27)
- Isaiah made a **pronouncement** against Babylon.
- The **pronouncement** against Babylon that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw in vision. (Isaiah 13:1)
- In the year that King Ahaz died Isaiah the prophet made a **pronouncement**.
- In the year that King Ahaz died this **pronouncement** occurred. (Isaiah 14:28)
- Isaiah later made **pronouncements** against Moab.
- The **pronouncement** against Moab! Because in the night it has been despoiled, Ar of Moab itself has been silenced. Because in the night it has been despoiled, Kir of Moab itself has been silenced. (Isaiah 15:1)
- Also he made **pronouncements** against Damascus.
- The **pronouncement** against Damascus! Look! Damascus removed from being a city, and she has become a heap, a decaying ruin. (Isaiah 17:1)
- Later also he made **pronouncements** against Egypt.

- The **pronouncement** against Egypt! Look! Yehowah is riding on a swift cloud and coming into Egypt. And the valueless gods of Egypt will certainly quiver because of him, and the very heart of Egypt will melt in the midst of it. (**Isaiah 19:1**)
- Still later he made **pronouncements** against the wilderness of the sea.
- The **pronouncement** against the wilderness of the sea. Like storm winds in the south in moving onward, from the wilderness it is coming, from a fear-inspiring land. (**Isaiah 21:1**)
- Later Isaiah also made a **pronouncement** against Dumah.
- The **pronouncement** against Dumah! To me there is one calling out from Seir. Watchman, what about the night? Watchman, what about the night? (**Isaiah 21:11**)
- The **pronouncement** against the desert plain! In the forest in the desert plain you will spend the night, O caravans of men of Dedan. (**Isaiah 21:13**)
- The **pronouncement** of the valley of the vision! What is the matter with you, then, that you have gone up in your entirety to the roofs? (**Isaiah 22:1**)
- The **pronouncement** of Tyre! Howl, you ships of Tarshish! for it has been despoiled from being a port, from being a place to enter in. From the land of Kittim it has been revealed to them. (**Isaiah 23:1**)
- The **pronouncement** against the beasts of the south! Through the land of distress and hard conditions, of the lion and the leopard growling, of the viper and the flying fiery snake, on the shoulders of full-grown asses they carry their resources, and on the humps of camels their supplies. In behalf of the people they will prove of no benefit. (**Isaiah 30:6**)
- Say to them; This is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; As regards the chieftain, there is this **pronouncement** against Jerusalem and all the house of Israel who are in the midst of them. (**Ezekiel 12:10**)
- Nahum made a **pronouncement** against Nineveh.

- The **pronouncement** against Nineveh! The book of the vision of Nahum the Elkoshite. (**Nahum 1:1**)
- The **pronouncement** that Habakkuk the prophet visioned. (**Habakkuk 1:1**)
- A **pronouncement!** The word of Yehowah is against the land of Hadrach, and Damascus is where it rests, for Yehowah has an eye on earthling man and on all the tribes of Israel. (**Zechariah 9:1**)
- A **pronouncement!** The word of Yehowah concerning Israel, is the utterance of Yehowah, the One who is stretching out the heavens and laying the foundation of the earth and forming the spirit of man inside him. (**Zechariah 12:1**)
- A **pronouncement!** The word of Yehowah concerning Israel by means of Malachi. (**Malachi 1:1**)
- Yet Yehowah corrects Elijah, he still has seven thousand men who have not bent the knee to **Baal**, or any other **master**, but Yehowah God. Elijah is not alone, there are others who care about true worship, and are who not intimidated by the persecution aimed at Elijah.
- Yet, what does the divine **pronouncement** say to him? I have left seven thousand men over for myself, men who have not bent the knee to Baal. (**Romans 11:4**)
