- How comely or attractive to the mountains, the nations, are the feet of the one bringing Good News. Who is this one publishing Good News to the nations? It is God's son, the Son of Man. Why is, what he says, Good News, because they are in anguish not knowing or seeing a way out of their present situation.
- The advent of God's Kingdom by his Christ, will crush all present warring rulerships, and bring in a thousand years of peace worldwide.
- This one is **publishing** peace, for the thousand years of God's rule has begun. He is bringing news of something better, a unified rulership, that rules by divine principles.
- He is publishing salvation because the revealing of the three signs of Moses indicates, that salvation by God, of all of the righteous ones who have exercised faith, is at hand! He is saying; Your God has become King. Yehowah did take up his great power to rule when he commissioned the Greater Moses and gave him the powerful three signs as proof of his commission.
- How comely upon the mountains are the feet of the one bringing Good News, the one publishing peace, the one bringing Good News of something better, the one publishing salvation, the one saying to Zion; Your God has become king! (Isaiah 52:7)
- That voice, that is publishing something hurtful today, is the Son of Man with many books, which foretell the fall of all religion and of Satan's entire system. The name Dan, means, God Is My Judge.
- For a voice is telling from Dan and is publishing something hurtful from the mountainous region of Ephraim. (Jeremiah 4:15)
- Yehowah now calls attention to his Messianic Kingdom of a thousand years, under his Messiah, and his 144,000 spirit anointed Christian sons. For look upon the mountains or governments of the earth, there is the one bringing Good News, the one publishing a time of peace. Yehowah God's people should rejoice in this, and come to their festivals with a happy heart, and pay their vows to their God, for

the time for Yehowah God to rule the earth in righteousness has at last come. In the future, no more will any good-for-nothing man pass through her gates, for all such ones in their entirety will be cut off from the very earth, they will not be.

- Look! Upon the mountains the feet of one bringing Good News, one publishing peace. O Judah, celebrate your festivals. Pay your vows, because no more will any good-for-nothing person pass again through you. In his entirety he will certainly be cut off. (Nahum 1:15)
- There in one of the principal cities of Cyprus, Salamis, they began their missionary experience together, and they first began to publish the word of Yehowah God in the synagogues of the Jews. Going along on this journey was John, or Mark, who served as an attendant to them. The first leg of their journey took about 130 miles in total, much of it by sea.
- And when they got to be in Salamis they began publishing the word of God in the synagogues of the Jews. They had John also as an attendant. (Acts of Apostles 13:5)
- This girl kept following after Paul and Silas and Timothy, crying out after them, that they were slaves of the Most High God, who were publishing the way of salvation to the men there.
- This girl kept following Paul and us and crying out with the words; These men are slaves of the Most High God, who are publishing to you the way of salvation. (Acts of Apostles 16:17)
- Then they told the magistrates, that they were publishing customs that it was not lawful for them as Roman citizens to practice, though never declaring what those customs were specifically.
- And they are publishing customs that it is not lawful for us to take up or practice, seeing we are Romans. (Acts of Apostles 16:21)
- There Paul would speak, and his method was to prove through references to the Holy Scriptures, that it was necessary for the Christ to rise from the dead. Then he would show how the man Jesus, whom he was publishing, was in fact, the scriptural fulfillment of these scriptures.

- Explaining and proving by references that it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead, and saying; This is the Christ, this Jesus whom I am publishing to you. (Acts of Apostles 17:3)
- Then he gave a concrete example of why he had said that. For as he was entering their city, he was carefully observing their various objects of veneration, their idols, and there he had found an altar with an inscription, To An Unknown God. So Paul used this veneration to introduce them to a god, then unknown to them, Yehowah God, for this is the one he was publishing to them.
- For instance, while passing along and carefully observing your objects of veneration I also found an altar on which had been inscribed; To an Unknown God. Therefore what you are unknowingly giving godly devotion to, this I am publishing to you. (Acts of Apostles 17:23)
