## ~PUBLISH (123)

[English, issue, put out, bring out, print, distribute, circulate]

- The men of Judah are in serious trouble with their God for not listening to him and following in his way. Their error will lead to trouble for all their land and all their people must be warned about it. Jeremiah is thus told to publish this in Jerusalem and blow a horn in warning.
- Tell it in Judah, you men, and publish it even in Jerusalem, and say it out, and blow a horn throughout the land. Call out loudly and say; Gather yourselves together, and let us enter into the fortified cities. (Jeremiah 4:5)
- Yes, tell it out among the nations, publish it, that the Son Of Man has come, and that Yehowah's day of accounting is at his right hand.
- Make mention of it, you people, yes, to the nations. Publish it against Jerusalem. Watchers are coming from a land far away, and they will let out their voice against the very cities of Judah. (Jeremiah 4:16)
- Tell this in the house of Jacob, and publish it in Judah, saying;
  (Jeremiah 5:20)
- Then a cry will go forth throughout the land of Spiritual Israel, the land of Jacob their father. Do not be afraid of the nations round about, but cry our shrilly. Publish it! Tell it out among all of the peoples! For Yehowah has saved the remnant of his people, and brought them back to their homeland, to restore true worship. Here, the voice of rejoicing will now reside, forever.
- For this is what Yehowah has said; Cryt out loudly to Jacob with rejoicing, and cry shrilly at the head of nations. Publish it. Give praise and say; Save, O Yehowah, your people, the remnant of Israel. (Jeremiah 31:7)
- Egypt's time also must come, when Yehowah turns his attention toward them, yes publish it in Migdol. Let it be known worldwide what the purpose of Yehowah the God of heaven and earth, is about to do respecting this entire system of things. You who are opposed to

Yehowah's way, take your stand against him, make preparation, for the sword will certainly devour all around you.

- Tell it in Egypt, O men, and publish it in Migdol, and publish it in Noph and in Tahpanhes. Say; Station yourself, making preparation also for yourself, for a sword will certainly devour all around you. (Jeremiah 46:14)
- It will happen suddenly, tell it out, publish it among the nations. Babylon has fallen. All of her false gods have been put to shame, Bel and Merodach are powerless against the God of truth, Yehowah. Her graven images have shuddered and fallen, for they possess no power against the living God Yehowah.
- Tell it among the nations and publish it. And lift up a signal, publish it. Hide nothing, O men. Say; Babylon has been captured. Bel has been put to shame. Merodach has become terrified. Her images have been put to shame. Her dungy idols have become terrified. (Jeremiah 50:2)
- Yehowah calls for this message to be published upon the dwelling towers of Ashdod, one of the five principal cities of the Philistines, and upon all the dwelling towers in the land of Egypt. They are to gather together against the mountains, or the government of Samaria, and they are to look upon her many disorders and cases of defrauding that are going on within her.
- Publish it on the dwelling towers in Ashdod and on the dwelling towers in the land of Egypt, and say; Be gathered together against the mountains of Samaria, and see the many disorders in the midst of her and cases of defrauding inside her. (Amos 3:9)
- Also from what is leavened they are called to make a thanksgiving sacrifice, and to make it smoke upon the altar there. All their sacrifices are leavened, or sinful. There also they can publish voluntary offerings, for that is the way that Israel has loved since the beginning of her separation from true worship in Judah and in Jerusalem, and the sons of Israel have loved it that way. Yehowah God though, has never approved of this way of false worship, for it is idol worship pure and simple.
- And from what is leavened make a thanksgiving sacrifice to smoke, and proclaim voluntary offerings. Publish it, for that is

the way you have loved, O sons of Israel, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (Amos 4:5)

- Matthew then shows, that this fulfilled a scripture in the Psalms, that the Messiah would speak thus, in riddles and illustrations, and publish things hidden since the founding of the world.
- That there might be fulfilled what was spoken through the prophet who said; I will open my mouth with illustrations, I will publish things hidden since the founding. (Matthew 13:35)
- These prophets had spoken, that the Messiah was to suffer, and that he would be the first to be resurrected from the dead. Thereafter he would publish light both to this people, the Jews, and to the nations.
- That the Christ was to suffer and, as the first to be resurrected from the dead, he was going to publish light both to this people and to the nations. (Acts of Apostles 26:23)
