- A country or people listed only in;
- And I will set among them a sign, and I will send some of those who are escaped to the nations, to Tarshish, **Pul**, and Lud, those drawing the bow, Tubal and Javan, the faraway islands, who have not heard a report about me or seen my glory, and they will for certain tell about my glory among the nations. (**Isaiah 66:19**)
- Along with Tarshish, apparently southern Spain, and Lud, in North Africa. Evidently all three places were noted for their skilled archers. The exact location of **Pul** is unknown. The **Greek Septuagint** reads, **Phud** or **Put** at;
- And I will set among them a sign, and I will send some of those who are escaped to the nations, to Tarshish, **Pul**, and Lud, those drawing the bow, Tubal and Javan, the faraway islands, who have not heard a report about me or seen my glory, and they will for certain tell about my glory among the nations. (**Isaiah 66:19**)
- Instead of **Pul**, and Put, identified with the Libyans in Africa, and Lud are linked in other texts.
- Persians and Ludim and men of Put, they happened to be in your military force, your men of war. Shield and helmet they hung up in you. They were the ones that caused your splendor. (**Ezekiel 27:10**)
- Go up, O you horses, and drive madly, O you chariots! And let the mighty men go forth, Cush and Put, who are handling the shield, and the Ludim, who are handling and treading the bow. (**Jeremiah 46:9**)
- However, the **Masoretic** texts reading of **Pul** is supported by the Dead Sea Scroll of Isaiah and the **Syriac Peshitta**. Some scholars have suggested that **Pul** was the island Philae in the Nile.
