~QOHPH (38)

- The 19th letter of the Hebrew alphabet. In translating Hebrew names where it occurs, *qohph* is usually represented in English by c or k, as in Cainan and Kish.
- The sound is stronger than that of the letter *kaph*, and is pronounced farther back in the throat, as a strong English **q** formed at the back of the palate. In the Hebrew, it is the initial letter in each of the eight verses in;
- I have called with my whole heart. Answer me, O Yehowah. Your regulations I will observe. (Psalms 119:145)
- I have called upon you. O save me! And I will keep your reminders. (Psalms 119:146)
- I have been up early in the morning twilight, that I may cry for help. For your words I have waited. (Psalms 119:147)
- My eyes have been ahead of the night watches, for me to concern myself with your saying; (Psalms 119:148)
- O do hear my own voice according to your loving-kindness. O Yehowah, according to your judicial decision preserve me alive. (Psalms 119:149)
- Those in pursuit of loose conduct have come near, they have got far away from your own Law. (Psalms 119:150)
- You are near, O Yehowah, and all your commandments are truth. (Psalms 119:151)
- Long ago I have known some of your reminders, for to time indefinite you have founded them. (Psalms 119:152)
