

~QUESTIONED (89)

[English, queried, inquired, Opposite of, answered]

- Throughout all of this accusation throwing and finger pointing, Jesus had remained silent, so now the High Priest approached him and **questioned** him, asking if he had nothing to say about it. Was he not going to answer these serious charges?
- Finally the High Priest rose in their midst and **questioned** Jesus, saying; Do you say nothing in reply? What is it these are testifying against you? (**Mark 14:60**)
- Later while Jesus was alone and praying, his disciples came together to him, and he put the **question** to them; Who are the crowds saying, that I am?
- Later, while he was praying alone, the disciples came together to him, and he **questioned** them, saying; Who are the crowds saying that I am? (**Luke 9:18**)
- Then a man approached and addressed Jesus as; Good Teacher, and **questioning** him. He then asked Jesus what he needed to do to get everlasting life.
- And a certain ruler **questioned** him, saying; Good Teacher, by doing what shall I inherit everlasting life? (**Luke 18:18**)
- So these deceitful men approached, and they tried to butter Jesus up with false compliments. They at first stated, that they knew he spoke and taught correctly and without partiality. They said that they felt, that he taught the way of God in line with truth.
- And they **questioned** him, saying; Teacher, we know you speak and teach correctly and show no partiality, but you teach the way of God in line with truth. (**Luke 20:21**)
- Then others of the party of the Sadducees came forward, and they too tried to test him out with seemingly difficult **questions**, that they felt could not be answered.
- However, some of the Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came up and **questioned** him. (**Luke 20:27**)

- So several of his disciples when they had got to be alone with Jesus, came and **questioned** him when all these thing he spoke about would take place, and what sign would show, that these things were destined to occur?
- Then they **questioned** him, saying; Teacher, when will these things actually be, and what will be the sign when these things are destined to occur? (**Luke 21:7**)
- He then told them, that if he **questioned** them, they would not answer at all. Now this may be a reference to their earlier refusal, to answer his question to them about John the Baptist, and the source of his works. For Jesus knew, that he would never get an honest answer from them.
- Moreover, if I **questioned** you, you would not answer at all. (**Luke 22:68**)
- So they **questioned** him further, why he had come baptizing, if he was not the Christ, or Elijah, or The Prophet?
- So they **questioned** him and said to him; Why, then, do you baptize if you yourself are not the Christ, or Elijah, or The Prophet? (**John 1:25**)
- Now while this was happening, the chief priest was **questioning** Jesus, about his disciples, and about his teachings.
- And so the chief priest **questioned** Jesus about his disciples and about his teaching. (**John 18:19**)
- So they brought the apostles before their Sanhedrin court, and then the High Priest began to **question** them accusingly.
- So they brought them and stood them in the Sanhedrin hall. And the High Priest **questioned** them (**Acts of Apostles 5:27**)
