- The Queen of Sheba came to question Solomon with perplexing questions.
- Now the queen of Sheba was hearing the report about Solomon in connection with the name of Yehowah. So she came to test him with perplexing questions. (1 Kings 10:1)
- And the queen of Sheba herself heard the report about Solomon, and she proceeded to come to test Solomon with perplexing questions at Jerusalem, along with a very impressive train and camels carrying balsam oil, and gold in great quantity, and precious stones. At length she came in to Solomon and spoke with him about everything that happened to be close to her heart. (2 Chronicles 9:1)
- Meanwhile the King of Judah, Zedekiah, came there repeatedly to Jeremiah, and asked him questions. Does there exist a word from Yehowah? He asked. But the answer was not one easily presented. It took courage and determination to live up to the truth on Jeremiah's part. The Answer; Into the hand of Babylon you will be given!
- And King Zedekiah proceeded to send and take him, and the king began asking him questions in his house in a place of concealment. And he went on to say; Does there exist a word from Yehowah? To this Jeremiah said; There does exist! And he said further; Into the hand of the king of Babylon you will be given! (Jeremiah 37:17)
- So then, when he went out from there, the scribes and Pharisees started to press in upon him terribly, and to press him with many questions.
- So when he went out from there the scribes and the Pharisees started in to press upon him terribly and to ply him with questions about further things. (Luke 11:53)
- The military commander then showed, that he had found Paul was accused of breaking certain of the Jews' own Laws, but was not

charged with anything that the Romans would consider a penalty deserving of death, or bonds.

- I found him to be accused about questions of their Law, but not charged with a single thing deserving of death or bonds. (Acts of Apostles 23:29)
- Paul also shows, that some are paying attention to false stories and the study of genealogies, things which end up in nothing of any spiritual value. Such studies only furnish questions for research, rather than a dispensing of anything from God, and in connection with true faith.
- Nor to pay attention to false stories and to genealogies, which end up in nothing, but which furnish questions for research rather than a dispensing of anything by God in connection with faith. (1 Timothy 1:4)
