~QUIETLY (82)

[English, silently, gently, inaudibly, softly, in silence, Opposite of, loudly]

- David quietly rose up and cut off the skirt of Saul's coat.
- And David's men began to say to him; Here is the day on which Yehowah does say to you, Look! I am giving your enemy into your hand, and you must do to him just as it may seem good in your eyes. So David rose up and quietly cut off the skirt of the sleeveless coat that belonged to Saul. (1 Samuel 24:4)
- Joab led Abner quietly aside, as if to speak privately with him, and then killed him.
- When Abner returned to Hebron, Joab now led him aside inside the gate to speak with him quietly. However, there he struck him in the abdomen, so that he died because of the blood of Asahel his brother. (2 Samuel 3:27)
- Then Habakkuk tells that he had heard, and then his belly began to be agitated. Also at the sound of what he heard, his lips quivered from fear, and rottenness began to enter into his bones, he feeling no power to arise. Then in his situation he decided to quietly wait for this day of distress, coming forth from Yehowah God, when, he will come up upon the people, that he may raid them, destroying their entire system of things.
- I heard, and my belly began to be agitated, at the sound my lips quivered, rottenness began to enter into my bones, and in my situation I was agitated, that I should quietly wait for the day of distress, for his coming up to the people, that he may raid them. (Habakkuk 3:16)
- However Paul relates about false brothers who were quietly brought in to sneak on their freedom, which they have in union with Christ. Their true object was to enslave them, to their own teachings.
- But because of the false brothers brought in quietly, who sneaked in to spy upon our freedom which we have in union with Christ Jesus, that they might completely enslave us. (Galatians 2:4)

- Paul counsels them, to make it their aim to live quietly, and to mind their own business, and to work with their hands to meet their own needs, just as he previously ordered them to do.
- And to make it your aim to live quietly and to mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we ordered you. (1 Thessalonians 4:11)
- Peter now warns anointed Christians, that many times in the past in the history of ancient Israel, that false prophets came forth to deceive and mislead the people. Peter warns that this will be the case among them also, in this current period of time, and in the future.
- Such ones will quietly bring in false understanding causing sects to form and bringing destruction to the true anointed congregation of God. They will proceed so far as to even disown their repurchaser, the Christ, the owner that bought them with his own precious blood, and then God will bring a speedy destruction upon all such ones. Therefore be wary!
- However, there also came to be false prophets among the people, as there will also be false teachers among you. These very ones will quietly bring in destructive sects and will disown even the owner that bought them, bringing speedy destruction upon themselves. (2 Peter 2:1)
