~REASONINGS (110)

[English, logic, rationale, consistent, articulation, lucid, Opposite of, illogical]

- Eluhu showed that he had patiently waited while the older men had articulated their reasonings.
- Look! I have waited for the words of you men, I kept giving ear to your reasonings, until you could search for words to say. (Job 32:11)
- Jesus now expounds on just why this is true. It is out of the heart that wicked reasonings come forth. From within the heart come forth the desires to murder, commit adultery, steal, lie and blaspheme God. Now, if a man has such feelings in his heart, and lets them out through his speech, then this truly defiles him. Really, even if he does not voice them, it defiles him, for his heart is not right before his God, or his fellowman.
- For example, out of the heart come wicked reasonings, murders, adulteries, fornications, thieveries, false testimonies, blasphemies. (Matthew 15:19)
- Jesus then elucidated on what he meant by that. It was out of the heart of men that wicked reasonings came forth. Things such as fornications, thievery and murder. These were they unlawful acts that defiled a man.
- For from inside, out of the heart of men, injurious reasonings issue forth, fornications, thieveries, murders. (Mark 7:21)
- Then Simeon prophesied that a long sword would be run through the soul of Mary herself, in order, that the unsound reasonings of many hearts, could be uncovered and made manifest.
- Yes, a long sword will be run through the soul of you yourself, in order, that the reasonings of many hearts may be uncovered. (Luke 2:35)
- However Jesus immediately knew what they were thinking about him, and the wicked reasonings of their hearts, so he asked them; What are you reasoning out in your hearts?

- But Jesus, discerning their reasonings, said in answer to them;
 What are you reasoning out in your hearts? (Luke 5:22)
- Jesus however already knew their reasonings, and was not going to back down from them, for their reasoning was flawed. So he said to the man with the withered hand for him to get up and come forth to him to the center of the room. Therefore the man rose and took his stand before them all.
- He, however, knew their reasonings, yet he said to the man with the withered hand; Get up and stand in the center. And he rose and took his stand. (Luke 6:8)
- Men have the capacity to reason, and to think about all these invisible qualities of God, but they fail to put their reasoning powers to use, and come to understand him accurately. Paul called them emptyheaded, and today we might use the term airheads.
- Their hearts, that is their source of motivation, are darkened, because they do not come to see and understand, the true reasons for living. They fail to see the purpose of the one who made us all, and to work in harmony with his will and purpose for all of us.
- Because, although they knew God, they did not glorify him as God nor did they thank him, but they became empty-headed in their reasonings and their unintelligent heart became darkened. (Romans 1:21)
- Yehowah is far superior to mankind in his thoughts and deeds, and he knows this ahead of time. To him the reasonings of the world's wise men are futile, for he already knows where they will end up, something that they cannot yet see, and have not fully reasoned out in their own minds.
- And again; Yehowah knows that the reasonings of the wise men are futile. (1 Corinthians 3:20)
- Christians are overturning wrong reasonings based upon worldly philosophies and Satanic ideas. That is why most of the people in Satan's system of things remain unreasonable, because they would be quickly defeated by sound reasoning that Christians use as weapons.

- Christians are making the knowledge of God to stand above all other enemies, victorious. We as Christians are bringing every thought of men into captivity, to make every thought captive to the Christ. God's ways are superior, and it is our privilege to show their superiority, by reasoning to all other men.
- For we are overturning reasonings and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are bringing every thought into captivity to make it obedient to the Christ. (2 Corinthians 10:5)
