## ~TEL-ASSAR (28) (Tel-as'sar)

- A place inhabited by the sons of Eden mentioned along with Gozan, Haran, and Rezeph sites in northern Mesopotamia.
- Have the gods of the nations that my forefathers brought to ruin delivered them, even Gozan and Haran and Rezeph and the sons of Eden that were in Tel-assar? (2 Kings 19:12)
- Have the gods of the nations that my forefathers brought to ruin delivered them, even Gozan and Haran and Rezeph and the sons of Eden that were in Tel-assar? (Isaiah 37:12)
- Sennacherib boasted, through his messengers, that the gods worshiped by the people of these places had been unable to deliver them from the power of his forefathers.
- Because of the reference to the sons of Eden, Tel-assar is generally associated with the small kingdom of Bit-adini along the Upper Euphrates.
- Assyrian monarchs Tiglath-pileser III and Esar-haddon both refer to a Til-Ashuri, but its location is considered to have been near the Assyrian border of Elam. Hence, identification of Tel-assar remains uncertain.
