## ~TEMANITE (50) (Te'man-ite) [Of, or belonging to, Teman]

- A term generally understood to refer to a native of Teman in Edom. An early Edomite king, Husham, came from the land of the Temanites, and Eliphaz, one of Job's three companions, was a Temanite.
- Now these are the kings who reigned in the land of Edom before any king reigned over the sons of Israel. (Genesis 36:31)
- And Bela son of Beor proceeded to reign in Edom, and the name of his city was Dinhabah. (Genesis 36:32)
- When Bela died, Jobab son of Zerah from Bozrah began to reign instead of him.
  (Genesis 36:33)
- When Jobab died, Husham from the land of the Temanites began to reign instead of him. (Genesis 36:34)
- And three companions of Job got to hear of all this calamity that had come upon him, and they proceeded to come, each one from his own place, Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite. So they met together by appointment to come and sympathize with him and comfort him. (Job 2:11)
- And Eliphaz the Temanite proceeded to reply and say; (Job 4:1)
- And it came about after Yehowah had spoken these words to Job, that Yehowah proceeded to say to Eliphaz the Temanite; My anger has grown hot against you and your two companions, for you men have not spoken concerning me what is truthful as has my servant Job. (Job 42:7)
- That Eliphaz came from Teman in Edom is suggested by the understanding that the land of Uz, where Job lived, was near Edom.
- Some scholars, however, believe that there is a possibility that the Eliphaz named in the book of Job was, not from Teman, but from Tema, a place identified with an oasis on the Arabian Peninsula about 400 kilometers (250 miles) Southeast of Ezion-geber.

The caravans of Tema have looked, the traveling company of Sabeans have waited for them. (Job 6:19)
