~TEMA 2 (66) (Te'ma)

- Probably the same as modern Taima, an oasis located about 400 kilometers (250 miles) Southeast of Ezion-geber, where two major caravan routes crossed.
- The caravans of **Tema** have looked, the traveling company of Sabeans have waited for them. (**Job 6:19**)
- Tema, along with nearby Dedan, is mentioned in the prophecies of;
- The pronouncement against the desert plain! In the forest in the desert plain you will spend the night, O caravans of men of Dedan. (Isaiah 21:13)
- To meet the thirsty one bring water. O you inhabitants of the land of Tema, confront the one fleeing away with bread for him. (Isaiah 21:14)
- For this is what Yehowah the God of Israel said to me; Take this cup of the wine of rage out of my hand, and you must make all the nations to whom I am sending you drink it. (Jeremiah 25:15)
- And they must drink and shake back and forth and act like crazed men because of the sword that I am sending among them.
 (Jeremiah 25:16)
- And I proceeded to take the cup out of the hand of Yehowah and to make all the nations drink to whom Yehowah had sent me. (Jeremiah 25:17)
- Namely, Jerusalem and the cities of Judah and her kings, her princes, to make them a devastated place, an object of astonishment, something to whistle at and a malediction, just as at this day. (Jeremiah 25:18)
- Pharaoh the king of Egypt and his servants and his princes and all his people. (Jeremiah 25:19)
- And all the mixed company, and all the kings of the land of Uz,

and all the kings of the land of the Philistines and Ashkelon and Gaza and Ekron and the remnant of Ashdod. (Jeremiah 25:20)

- Edom and Moab and the sons of Ammon. (Jeremiah 25:21)
- And all the kings of Tyre and all the kings of Sidon and the kings of the island that is in the region of the sea. (Jeremiah 25:22)
- And Dedan and Tema and Buz and all those with hair clipped at the temples. (Jeremiah 25:23)
- In this latter prophecy Tema was specifically named as among the places whose inhabitants would be compelled to drink of Yehowah's, cup of the wine of rage.
- Babylonian King Nabonidus apparently established a second capital in Tema, leaving Belshazzar at Babylon in charge during his absence.
