~TIBERIAS 1 (22) (Ti-be'ri-as)

- A city built by Herod Antipas about 21 C.E, and named after Tiberius Caesar, emperor of the Roman Empire at the time. It is still called Tiberias, or Teverya, and is situated about 25 kilometers (15 miles) East-Northeast of Nazareth, on a comparatively narrow strip along the western shore of the Sea of Galilee, 210 meters (690 feet) below the level of the Mediterranean.
- Tiberias was about 15 kilometers (9.5 miles) around the sea from Capernaum and 9 kilometers (5.5 miles) above where the Jordan leaves that body of water.
- Here Herod as the tetrarch made his residence. Nearby, to the South of the city, were famous warm springs. The city is mentioned only once in the Scriptures.
- But boats from Tiberias arrived near the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks. (John 6:23)
