~TIBHATH (36) (Tib'hath) [Slaughter]

- A city North of Palestine from which David took a great quantity of copper after striking down Hadadezer, king of Zobah, at Hamath, about 230 kilometers (140 miles) North-Northeast of Dan.
- And David went on to strike down Hadadezer the king of Zobah at Hamath as he was going his way to set up his control at the river Euphrates. (1 Chronicles 18:3)
- And from Tibhath and Cun, cities of Hadadezer, David took very much copper. With it Solomon made the copper sea and the pillars and the copper utensils. (1 Chronicles 18:8)
- In the parallel description of David's campaign at;
- And from Betah and Berothai, cities of Hadadezer, King David took copper in very great quantity. (2 Samuel 8:8)
- Tibhath is apparently called Betah. Some suggest that Tibhath may have been named for Nahor's son Tebah.
- There was his concubine too, whose name was Reumah. In time she herself also gave birth to Tebah and Gaham and Tahash and Maacah. (Genesis 22:24)
- In harmony with its being part of the Aramaean kingdom of Zobah, the location of Tibhath was probably in the valley lying between the Lebanon and Anti-Lebanon mountains. Traces of ancient copperworks have been found in Lebanon, in harmony with the Biblical account.
