

~TIMNA 3 (52)
(Tim'na)

- The first name found in the list of 11 sheiks of Esau, or Edom.
- So these are the names of the sheiks of Esau according to their families, according to their places, by their names: Sheik **Timna**, Sheik Alvah, Sheik Jetheth. (**Genesis 36:40**)
- Sheik Oholibamah, Sheik Elah, Sheik Pinon, Sheik Kenaz, Sheik Teman, sheik Mibzar. (**Genesis 36:41**)
- Sheik Kenaz, Sheik Teman, Sheik Mibzar. (**Genesis 36:42**)
- Sheik Magdiel, Sheik Iram. These are the sheiks of Edom according to their dwellings in the land of their possession. This is Esau the father of Edom. (**Genesis 36:43**)
- Eventually Hadad died. And the sheiks of Edom came to be Sheik **Timna**, Sheik Alvah, Sheik Jetheth. (**1 Chronicles 1:51**)
- Sheik Oholibamah, Sheik Elah, Sheik Pinon. (**1 Chronicles 1:52**)
- Sheik Kenaz, Sheik Teman, Sheik Mibzar. (**1 Chronicles 1:53**)
- Sheik Magdiel, Sheik Iram. These were the sheiks of Edom. (**1 Chronicles 1:54**)
- In the view of many translators, **Timna** and the other names listed are personal names. **AS, KJ, JB, NW, RS**
- However, it is generally acknowledged that the expression according to their families, according to their **places**, by their names indicates that a tribe or an area is meant.
- Some versions therefore prefer expressions such as the chief of **Timna**. **JP, AT** In fact, at,
- Sheik Oholibamah, Sheik Elah, Sheik Pinon, Sheik Kenaz, Sheik Teman, Sheik Mibzar. (**Genesis 36:41**)

- In the same list, a woman's name, Oholibamah, appears, allowing for the name **Timna** to be that of a woman. Eusebius and Jerome identified **Timna** with an Edomite site called, **Thamna**, which stood in their day. [Onomasticon, 96,24-27]
- However, the location of any such region named for **Timna** is currently unknown.
