- Thus Abram got to hear that his brother had been taken captive. With that he mustered his **trained** men, three hundred and eighteen slaves born in his household, and went in pursuit up to Dan. (**Genesis 14:14**)

(**1 Chronicles 18:10**)
- And the number of them together with their brothers **trained** in song to Yehowah, all experts, came to be two hundred and eighty-eight. (**1 Chronicles 25:7**)
- I have positively heard Ephraim bemoaning himself; You have corrected me, that I may be corrected, like a calf that has not been **trained**. Cause me to turn back, and I shall readily turn back, for you are Yehowah my God. (**Jeremiah 31:18**)
- And Ephraim was a **trained** heifer loving to thresh, and I, for my part, passed over her good-looking neck. I make someone ride Ephraim. Judah plows. Jacob harrows for him. (**Hosea 10:11**)

- But solid food belongs to mature people, to those who through use have their perceptive powers **trained** to distinguish both right and wrong. (**Hebrews 5:14**)
- True, no discipline seems for the present to be joyous, but grievous, yet afterward to those who have been **trained** by it, it yields peaceable fruit, namely, righteousness. (**Hebrews 12:11**)
