## ~TREASURES ## (243)

[English, resources, riches, reserves, materials, assets, possessions]

- Finally all the work that King Solomon had to do as regards the house of Yehowah was at its completion, and Solomon began to bring in the things made holy by David his father, the silver and the gold and the articles he put in the treasures of the house of Yehowah. (1 Kings 7:51)
- And he got to take the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the treasures of the house of the king, and everything he took. And he went on to take all the gold shields that Solomon had made. (1 Kings 14:26)
- At that Asa took all the silver and the gold that were left in the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the treasures of the house of the king and put them in the hand of his servants, and King Asa now sent them to Ben-hadad the son of Tabrimmon the son of Hezion, the king of Syria, who was dwelling in Damascus, saying; (1 Kings 15:18)
- At that Jehoash the king of Judah took all the holy offerings that Jehoshaphat and Jehoram and Ahaziah his forefathers, the kings of Judah, had sanctified and his own holy offerings and all the gold to be found in the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the house of the king and sent them to Hazael the king of Syria. So he withdrew from against Jerusalem. (2 Kings 12:18)
- And he took all the gold and silver and all the articles to be found at the house of Yehowah and in the treasures of the house of the king and the hostages and then returned to Samaria. (2 Kings 14:14)
- Accordingly Ahaz took the silver and the gold that was to be found at the house of Yehowah and in the treasures of the king's house and sent the king of Assyria a bribe. (2 Kings 16:8)
- Therefore Hezekiah gave all the silver that was to be found at the house of Yehowah and in the treasures of the king's house. (2 Kings 18:15)
- And Hezekiah proceeded to listen to them and show them all his

treasure-house, the silver and the gold and the balsam oil and the good oil and his armory and all that was to be found in his treasures. There proved to be nothing that Hezekiah did not show them in his own house and in all his dominion. (2 Kings 20:13)

- And he went on to say; What did they see in your house? To this Hezekiah said; Everything that is in my house they saw. There proved to be nothing that I did not show them in my treasures. (2 Kings 20:15)
- Then he brought out from there all the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the treasures of the king's house, and went on to cut to pieces all the gold utensils that Solomon the king of Israel had made in the temple of Yehowah, just as Yehowah had spoken. (2 Kings 24:13)
- For in office of trust there were four mighty men of the gatekeepers. They were Levites, and they proved to be in charge of the dining rooms and of the treasures of the house of the true God. (1 Chronicles 9:26)
- As regards the Levites, Ahijah was over the treasures of the house of the true God and over the treasures of the things made holy. (1 Chronicles 26:20)
- The sons of Jehieli, Zetham and Joel his brother, were over the treasures of the house of Yehowah. (1 Chronicles 26:22)
- This Shelomoth and his brothers were over all the treasures of the things made holy, that David the king and the heads of the paternal houses, and the chiefs of the thousands and of the hundreds, and the chiefs of the army had made holy. (1 Chronicles 26:26)
- And over the treasures of the king there was Azmaveth the son of Adiel. And over the treasures in the field, in the cities and in the villages and in the towers there was Jonathan the son of Uzziah. (1 Chronicles 27:25)
- Even the architectural plan of everything that had come to be with him by inspiration for the courtyards of Yehowah's house and for all the dining rooms all around, for the treasures of the house of the true God and for the treasures of the things made

## holy. (1 Chronicles 28:12)

- Finally all the work that Solomon had to do for the house of Yehowah was at its completion, and Solomon began to bring in the things made holy by David his father, and the silver and the gold and all the utensils he put in the treasures of the house of the true God. (2 Chronicles 5:1)
- So Shishak the king of Egypt came up against Jerusalem and took the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the treasures of the king's house. Everything he took, and so he took the gold shields that Solomon had made. (2 Chronicles 12:9)
- As a now brought out silver and gold from the treasures of Yehowah's house and the king's house and sent to Ben-hadad the king of Syria, who was dwelling at Damascus, saying; (2 Chronicles 16:2)
- And he took all the gold and the silver and all the articles that were to be found in the house of the true God with Obed-edom and the treasures of the king's house and the hostages, and then returned to Samaria. (2 Chronicles 25:24)
- And all the utensils, great and small, of the house of the true God and the treasures of the house of Yehowah and the treasures of the king and of his princes, everything he brought to Babylon. (2 Chronicles 36:18)
- And now if to the king it seems good, let there be an investigation in the king's house of treasures that is there in Babylon, whether it is so that from Cyrus the king an order was put through to rebuild that house of God in Jerusalem, and the decision of the king concerning this let him send to us. (Ezra 5:17)
- It was then that Darius the king put an order through, and they made an investigation in the house of the records of the treasures deposited there in Babylon. (Ezra 6:1)
- And the rest of the necessities of the house of your God that it devolves upon you to give, you will give out of the king's house of treasures. (Ezra 7:20)
- Why are there those waiting for death, and it is not, although

they keep digging for it more than for hidden treasures? (Job 3:21)

- If you keep seeking for it as for silver, and as for hid treasures you keep searching for it. (Proverbs 2:4)
- The treasures of the wicked one will be of no benefit, but righteousness is what will deliver from death. (Proverbs 10:2)
- The getting of treasures by a false tongue is an exhalation driven away, in the case of those seeking death. (Proverbs 21:6)
- And their land is filled with silver and gold, and there is no limit to their treasures. And their land is filled with horses, and there is no limit to their chariots. (Isaiah 2:7)
- So Hezekiah began to rejoice over them and proceeded to show them his treasure-house, the silver and the gold and the balsam oil and the good oil and all his armory and all that was to be found in his treasures. There proved to be nothing that Hezekiah did not show them in his own house and in all his dominion. (Isaiah 39:2)
- And he went on to say; What did they see in your house? To this Hezekiah said; Everything that is in my house they saw. There proved to be nothing that I did not show them in my treasures. (Isaiah 39:4)
- And I will give you the treasures in the darkness and the hidden treasures in the concealment places, in order, that you may know that I am Yehowah, the One calling you by your name, the God of Israel. (Isaiah 45:3)
- Your resources and your treasures I shall give for mere plunder, not for a price, but for all your sins, even in all your territories. (Jeremiah 15:13)
- On the mountains in the field. Your resources, all your treasures, I shall give for mere plunder, your high places because of sin throughout all your territories. (Jeremiah 17:3)
- And I will give all the stored-up things of this city and all its product and all its precious things, and all the treasures of the kings of Judah I am going to give into the hand of their enemies.

And they will certainly plunder them and take them and bring them to Babylon. (Jeremiah 20:5)

- But there were ten men that were found among them who immediately said to Ishmael; Do not put us to death, for there exist in our possession hidden treasures in the field, wheat and barley and oil and honey. So he refrained, and he did not put them to death in the midst of their brothers. (Jeremiah 41:8)
- Because your trust is in your works and in your treasures, you yourself will also be captured. And Chemosh will certainly go forth into exile, his priests and his princes at the same time. (Jeremiah 48:7)
- Why do you brag about the low plains, your flowing low plain, O daughter unfaithful, you the one trusting in her treasures, saying; Who will come to me? (Jeremiah 49:4)
- There is a sword against their horses and against their war chariots and against all the mixed company that are in the midst of her, and they will certainly become women. There is a sword against her treasures, and they will actually be plundered. (Jeremiah 50:37)
- O woman residing on abounding waters, abundant in treasures, your end has come, the measure of your profit making. (Jeremiah 51:13)
- And he will actually rule over the hidden treasures of the gold and the silver and over all the desirable things of Egypt. And the Libyans and the Ethiopians will be at his steps. (Daniel 11:43)
- O the extent to which those of Esau have been searched out! How his concealed treasures have been sought out! (Obadiah 1:6)
- Do there yet exist in the house of a wicked one the treasures of wickedness, and the scrimped ephah measure that is denounced? (Micah 6:10)
- And when they went into the house they saw the young child with Mary its mother, and, falling down, they did obeisance to it. They also opened their treasures and presented it with gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. (Matthew 2:11)

- Stop storing up for yourselves treasures upon the earth, where moth and rust consume, and where thieves break in and steal. (Matthew 6:19)
- Rather, store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes, and where thieves do not break in and steal. (Matthew 6:20)
- Carefully concealed in him are all the treasures of wisdom and of knowledge. (Colossians 2:3)
- Because he esteemed the reproach of the Christ as riches greater than the treasures of Egypt, for he looked intently toward the payment of the reward. (Hebrews 11:26)
