## ~TSADHEH (36) (tsa-dheh')

- The 18th letter of the Hebrew alphabet. It is one of the five Hebrew letters that have a different form when used as the final letter of a word.
- It has a strong hissing sound similar to the sound of ts in English. In the Hebrew, it appears as the initial letter in each of the eight verses in;
- You are righteous, O Yehowah, and your judicial decisions are upright. (Psalms 119:137)
- You have commanded your reminders in righteousness and in exceeding faithfulness. (Psalms 119:138)
- My ardor has made an end of me, because my adversaries have forgotten your words. (Psalms 119:139)
- Your saying is very much refined, and your own servant loves it. (Psalms 119:140)
- I am insignificant and contemptible. Your orders I have not forgotten. (Psalms 119:141)
- Your righteousness is a righteousness to time indefinite, and your Law is truth. (Psalms 119:142)
- Distress and difficulty themselves found me. Your commandments I was fond of. (Psalms 119:143)
- The righteousness of your reminders is to time indefinite. Make me understand, that I may keep living. (Psalms 119:144)
