

## ~TUMULT ## (35)

[English, uproar, commotion, hubhub, clamor, din, turmoil, furor, mayhem, chaos, disorder, confusion, turbulence, Opposite of, **peace**]

- I shall see him, but not now. I shall behold him, but not near. A star will certainly step forth out of Jacob, and a scepter will indeed rise out of Israel. And he will certainly break apart the temples of Moab's head and the cranium of all the sons of **tumult** of war. (**Numbers 24:17**)
- Why have the nations been in **tumult** and the national groups themselves kept muttering an empty thing? (**Psalms 2:1**)
- May you conceal me from the confidential talk of evildoers, from the **tumult** of practicers of hurtfulness. (**Psalms 64:2**)
- And I got to hear the sound of their wings, a sound like that of vast waters, like the sound of the Almighty One, when they went, the sound of a **tumult**, like the sound of an encampment. When they stood still, they would let their wings down. (**Ezekiel 1:24**)
- But some in the crowd began shouting out one thing, and others another. So, being unable himself to learn anything certain because of the **tumult**, he commanded him to be brought to the soldiers quarters. (**Acts of Apostles 21:34**)
- While I was at these matters they found me ceremonially cleansed in the temple, but not with a crowd or with a **tumult**. But there were certain Jews from the district of Asia. (**Acts of Apostles 24:18**)
