

~TYCHICUS (85)

(Tych'i-cus) [from a root meaning, fortune, success]

- One of Paul's aides, a beloved brother and faithful minister and fellow slave in the Lord from the District of Asia.
- All my affairs **Tychicus**, my beloved brother and faithful minister and fellow slave in the Lord, will make known to you. (**Colossians 4:7**)
- **Tychicus** was a member of Paul's party returning from Greece through Macedonia into Asia Minor, but whether or not Tychicus went all the way to Jerusalem is not stated.
- After going through those parts and encouraging the ones there with many a word, he came into Greece. (**Acts of Apostles 20:2**)
- And when he had spent three months there, because a plot was hatched against him by the Jews as he was about to set sail for Syria, he made up his mind to return through Macedonia. (**Acts of Apostles 20:3**)
- There were accompanying him Sopater the son of Pyrrhus of Beroea, Aristarchus and Secundus of the Thessalonians, and Gaius of Derbe, and Timothy, and from the district of Asia **Tychicus** and Trophimus. (**Acts of Apostles 20:4**)
- **Tychicus** is one of several persons suggested as **the brother** who, while in Greece, helped Titus to arrange the collection for the brothers in Judea.
- But we are sending along with him the brother whose praise in connection with the Good News has spread through all the congregations. (**2 Corinthians 8:18**)
- Not only that, but he was also appointed by the congregations to be our traveling companion in connection with this kind gift to be administered by us for the glory of the Lord and in proof of our ready mind. (**2 Corinthians 8:19**)
- I urged Titus and I dispatched the brother with him. Titus did not take advantage of you at all, did he? We walked in the same

spirit, did we not? In the same footsteps, did we not? (**2 Corinthians 12:18**)

- From his prison in Rome, Paul sent **Tychicus** with letters to Ephesus and Colossae, promising that **Tychicus** would tell them more about his state of affairs and be of comfort to them. Onesimus is mentioned in the letter to the Colossians as accompanying him.
- Now in order, that you may also know about my affairs, as to how I am doing, **Tychicus**, a beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, will make everything known to you. (**Ephesians 6:21**)
- I am sending him to you for this very purpose, that you may know of the things having to do with us and that he may comfort your hearts. (**Ephesians 6:22**)
- All my affairs **Tychicus**, my beloved brother and faithful minister and fellow slave in the Lord, will make known to you. (**Colossians 4:7**)
- For the very purpose of your knowing the things having to do with us and that he may comfort your hearts, I am sending him to you (**Colossians 4:8**)
- Along with Onesimus, my faithful and beloved brother, who is from among you. All the things here they will make known to you. (**Colossians 4:9**)
- Following Paul's release from prison, he contemplated sending either Artemas or **Tychicus** to Crete.
- When I send Artemas or **Tychicus** to you, do your utmost to come to me at Nicopolis, for there is where I have decided to winter. (**Titus 3:12**)
- When the apostle was back in a Roman prison for the second time, he dispatched **Tychicus** to Ephesus.
- But I have sent **Tychicus** off to Ephesus. (**2 Timothy 4:12**)
