- The sixth letter of the **Hebrew** alphabet. In pronunciation this letter corresponds generally to the English **w**, as in **wine**, at times, however, in modern Hebrew it is given the sound of English **v**.
- In this work it is transliterated as, **w**, **u**, and **oh**. It is rarely used as an initial letter, usually being substituted for by the letter **yohdh**. In the Hebrew, it appears at the beginning of each of the eight verses of
