- And it came about after these things that it was said to Joseph; Look, your father is becoming weak. At that he took with him his two sons Manasseh and Ephraim. (Genesis 48:1)
- And in case your brother grows poor and so he is financially weak alongside you, you must also sustain him. As an alien resident and a settler, he must keep alive with you. (Leviticus 25:35)
- And you must see what the land is and the people who are dwelling on it, whether they are strong or weak, whether they are few or many. (Numbers 13:18)
- Then Samson said to her; If they tie me with seven still-moist sinews that have not been dried out, I must also grow weak and become like an ordinary man. (Judges 16:7)
- So he said to her; If they tie me tight with new ropes with which no work has been done, I must also grow weak and become like an ordinary man. (Judges 16:11)
- Finally he disclosed to her all his heart and said to her; A razor has never come upon my head, because I am a Nazirite of God from my mothers belly. If I did get shaved, my power also would certainly depart from me, and I should indeed grow weak and become like all other men. (Judges 16:17)
- And I today am weak although anointed as king, and these men, the sons of Zeruiah, are too severe for me. May Yehowah repay the doer of what is bad according to his own badness. (2 Samuel 3:39)
- Look! You have corrected many, and the weak hands you used to strengthen. (Job 4:3)
- From vexation my eye has become weak, it has grown old because of all those showing hostility to me. (Psalms 6:7)
- Show me favor, O Yehowah, for I am in sore straits. With

vexation my eye has become weak, my soul and my belly. (Psalms 31:9)

- For with grief my life has come to an end, and my years in sighing. Because of my error my power has stumbled, and my very bones have become weak. (Psalms 31:10)
- All of them speak up and say to you, Have you yourself also been made weak like us? Is it to us that you have been made comparable? (Isaiah 14:10)
- Strengthen the weak hands, you people, and make the knees that are wobbling firm. (Isaiah 35:3)
- Beat your plowshares into swords and your pruning shears into lances. As for the weak one, let him say; I am a powerful man. (Joel 3:10)
- Keep on the watch and pray continually, that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit, of course, is eager, but the flesh is weak. (Matthew 26:41)
- Men, keep on the watch and praying, in order, that you do not come into temptation. The spirit, of course, is eager, but the flesh is weak. (Mark 14:38)
- I have exhibited to you in all things that by thus laboring you must assist those who are weak, and must bear in mind the words of the Lord Jesus, when he himself said; There is more happiness in giving than there is in receiving. (Acts of Apostles 20:35)
- Then Paul answered; What are you doing by weeping and making me weak at heart? Rest assured, I am ready not only to be bound but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus. (Acts of Apostles 21:13)
- And, although he did not grow weak in faith, he considered his own body, now already deadened, as he was about one hundred years old, also the deadness of the womb of Sarah. (Romans 4:19)
- For, indeed, Christ, while we were yet weak, died for ungodly men at the appointed time. (Romans 5:6)

- For, there being an incapability on the part of the Law, while it was weak through the flesh, God, by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and concerning sin, condemned sin in the flesh. (Romans 8:3)
- One man has faith to eat everything, but the man who is weak eats vegetables. (Romans 14:2)
- Because a foolish thing of God is wiser than men, and a weak thing of God is stronger than men. (1 Corinthians 1:25)
- But God chose the foolish things of the world, that he might put the wise men to shame, and God chose the weak things of the world, that he might put the strong things to shame. (1 Corinthians 1:27)
- We are fools because of Christ, but you are discreet in Christ, we are weak, but you are strong; You are in good repute, but we are in dishonor. (1 Corinthians 4:10)
- Nevertheless, there is not this knowledge in all persons, but some, being accustomed until now to the idol, eat food as something sacrificed to an idol, and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. (1 Corinthians 8:7)
- But keep watching that this authority of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to those who are weak. (1 Corinthians 8:9)
- For if anyone should see you, the one having knowledge, reclining at a meal in an idol temple, will not the conscience of that one who is weak be built up to the point of eating foods offered to idols? (1 Corinthians 8:10)
- Really, by your knowledge, the man that is weak is being ruined, your brother for whose sake Christ died. (1 Corinthians 8:11)
- But when you people thus sin against your brothers and wound their conscience that is weak, you are sinning against Christ. (1 Corinthians 8:12)
- To the weak I became weak, that I might gain the weak. I have become all things to people of all sorts, that I might by all means

save some. (1 Corinthians 9:22)

- That is why many among you are weak and sickly, and quite a few are sleeping in death. (1 Corinthians 11:30)
- For, say they; His letters are weighty and forceful, but his presence in person is weak and his speech contemptible. (2 Corinthians 10:10)
- I say this to our dishonor, as though our position had been weak.
 But if anyone else acts bold in something, I am talking
 unreasonably, I too am acting bold in it. (2 Corinthians 11:21)
- Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is stumbled, and I am not incensed? (2 Corinthians 11:29)
- Therefore I take pleasure in weaknesses, in insults, in cases of need, in persecutions and difficulties, for Christ. For when I am weak, then I am powerful. (2 Corinthians 12:10)
- Since you are seeking a proof of Christ speaking in me, Christ who is not weak toward you but is powerful among you. (2 Corinthians 13:3)
- True, indeed, he was impaled owing to weakness, but he is alive owing to God's power. True, also, we are weak with him, but we shall live together with him owing to God's power toward you. (2 Corinthians 13:4)
- We certainly rejoice whenever we are weak but you are powerful, and for this we are praying, your being readjusted. (2 Corinthians 13:9)
- But now that you have come to know God, or rather now that you have come to be known by God, how is it that you are turning back again to the weak and beggarly elementary things and want to slave for them over again? (Galatians 4:9)
- On the other hand, we exhort you, brothers, admonish the disorderly, speak consolingly to the depressed souls, support the weak, be long-suffering toward all. (1 Thessalonians 5:14)
- For from these arise those men who slyly work their way into households and lead as their captives weak women loaded down

with sins, led by various desires. (2 Timothy 3:6)

Stayed the force of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, from a weak state were made powerful, became valiant in war, routed the armies of foreigners. (Hebrews 11:34)
