[English, wasted, emaciated, shrunken, thin, shriveled, wilted, dried up, shrunk, drooped, faded, Opposite of, **blossomed**]

- Because the terraces themselves of Heshbon have **withered**. The vine of Sibmah, the owners of the nations themselves have smitten down its bright-red branches. - In these a multitude of the sick, blind, lame and those with **withered** members, was lying down. (**John 5:3**)
