## ~WORM (59)

[Hebrew, toh-le-`ah' or toh-la'`ath]

- Any of a great variety of slender crawling or creeping animals, usually having soft bodies and being legless or virtually so. In Scripture, worm often appears to denote the larval stage of insects, particularly maggots.
- But they did not listen to Moses. When some men would leave some of it until the morning, it would breed worms and stink, so that Moses became indignant at them. (Exodus 16:20)
- Accordingly they saved it up until the morning, just as Moses had commanded, and it did not stink nor did maggots develop in it. (Exodus 16:24)
- Down to Sheol your pride has been brought, the din of your stringed instruments. Beneath you, maggots are spread out as a couch, and worms are your covering. (Isaiah 14:11)
- And they will actually go forth and look upon the carcasses of the men that were transgressing against me, for the very worms upon them will not die and their fire itself will not be extinguished, and they must become something repulsive to all flesh. (Isaiah 66:24)
- At other times the reference is not to maggots but to worms that feed on vegetation.
- Vineyards you will plant and certainly cultivate, but you will drink no wine and gather nothing in, because the worm will eat it up. (Deuteronomy 28:39)
- But the true God appointed a worm at the ascending of the dawn on the next day, that it should strike the bottle-gourd plant, and it gradually dried up. (Jonah 4:7)
- The term, worm, also appears in an illustrative setting. Bildad disparagingly spoke of man as a worm.
- How much less so mortal man, who is a maggot, and a son of man, who is a worm! (Job 25:6)

- And it was foretold that the Messiah would be viewed as a reproach and despicable, as a worm.
- But I am a worm, and not a man, a reproach to men and despicable to the people. (Psalms 22:6)
- Yehowah God referred to Israel as a worm, a lowly and helpless creature, seemingly at the mercy of anyone passing by. But Yehowah assured the Israelites of his help and encouraged them not to be afraid.
- Do not be afraid, you worm Jacob, you men of Israel. I myself will help you, is the utterance of Yehowah, even your Repurchaser, the Holy One of Israel. (Isaiah 41:14)
