My lord, listen to me. A land plot worth four hundred silver shekels, what is that between me and you? So bury your dead. (Genesis 23:15)

At this all the people that were in the gate and the older men said; Witnesses! May Yehowah grant the wife who is coming into your house to be like Rachel and like Leah, both of whom built the house of Israel, and you prove your worth in Ephrathah and make a notable name in Bethlehem. (Ruth 4:11)

But the people said; You must not go out, for if we should at all flee, they would not set heart upon us, and if half of us would die, they would not set heart upon us, because you are worth ten thousand of us, and now it would be better if you would be of service to us to give help from the city. (2 Samuel 18:3)

In time a great famine arose in Samaria, and, look! They were besieging it until an asss head got to be worth eighty silver pieces, and the fourth of a cab measure of doves dung was worth five silver pieces. (2 Kings 6:25)

- Elisha now said; Listen, you men, to the word of Yehowah. This is what Yehowah has said; Tomorrow about this time a seah measure of fine flour will be worth a shekel, and two seah measures of barley worth a shekel in the gateway of Samaria. (2 Kings 7:1)

And the people proceeded to go out and plunder the camp of the Syrians, and so a seah measure of fine flour came to be worth a shekel, and two seah measures of barley worth a shekel, according to the word of Yehowah. (2 Kings 7:16)

Thus it came about just as the man of the true God had spoken to the king, saying; Two seah measures of barley worth a shekel and a seah measure of fine flour worth a shekel it will come to be tomorrow at this time in the gateway of Samaria. (2 Kings 7:18)

Accordingly they gave to the service of the house of the true God
gold worth five thousand talents and ten thousand darics and silver worth ten thousand talents and copper worth eighteen thousand talents and iron worth a hundred thousand talents. (1 Chronicles 29:7)

Thus I weighed out into their hand six hundred and fifty talents of silver and a hundred silver utensils worth two talents, and gold a hundred talents. (Ezra 8:26)

And twenty small gold bowls worth a thousand darics and two utensils of good copper, gleaming red, as desirable as gold. (Ezra 8:27)

Coral and rock crystal themselves will not be mentioned, but a bagful of wisdom is worth more than one full of pearls. (Job 28:18)

The tongue of the righteous one is choice silver, the heart of the wicked one is worth little. (Proverbs 10:20)

And it must occur in that day that every place where there used to be a thousand vines, worth a thousand pieces of silver, will come to be, for the thornbushes and for the weeds it will come to be. (Isaiah 7:23)

And Sodom your sister did not prove to be anything worth hearing about from your mouth in the day of your pride. (Ezekiel 16:56)

- Out of you there will actually go forth one who is thinking up against Yehowah what is bad, counseling what is not worth while. (Nahum 1:11)

Observe intently the birds of heaven, because they do not sow seed or reap or gather into storehouses, still your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth more than they are? (Matthew 6:26)

Therefore have no fear. You are worth more than many sparrows. (Matthew 10:31)

All considered, of how much more worth is a man than a sheep! So it is lawful to do a fine thing on the Sabbath. (Matthew 12:12)

In reply he said to them; You give them something to eat. At this they said to him; Shall we go off and buy two hundred denarii worth of loaves and give them to the people to eat? (Mark 6:37)

And this loving him with ones whole heart and with ones whole understanding and with ones whole strength and this loving ones neighbor as oneself is worth far more than all the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices. (Mark 12:33)

- But even the hairs of your heads are all numbered. Have no fear; You are worth more than many sparrows. (Luke 12:7)

For the soul is worth more than food and the body than clothing. (Luke 12:23)

Mark well that the ravens neither sow seed nor reap, and they have neither barn nor storehouse, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more worth are you than birds? (Luke 12:24)

Philip answered him; Two hundred denarii worth of loaves is not enough for them, so that each one may get a little. (John 6:7)

Indeed, quite a number of those who practiced magical arts brought their books together and burned them up before everybody. And they calculated together the prices of them and found them worth fifty thousand pieces of silver. (Acts of Apostles 19:19)

- By faith Abel offered God a sacrifice of greater worth than Cain, through which faith he had witness borne to him that he was righteous, God bearing witness respecting his gifts, and through it he, although he died, yet speaks. (Hebrews 11:4)
