~YEHOWAH-NISSI (19)

(Ye-ho'wah-nis'si)

- The name of the memorial altar erected by Moses after Israel's successful battle against the Amalekites at Rephidim. (Exodus 17:8,13-16)
- The name means, Yehowah Is My Signal Pole, deriving *nis-si'* from *nes*, signal pole.
- The Greek Septuagint translators understood *nis-si'* to be derived from *nus*, flee for refuge, and rendered it, Yehowah Is My Refuge, while in the Latin Vulgate it was thought to be derived from *na-sas'*, hoist, lift up, and was rendered, Yehowah Is My Exaltation.
- And Moses proceeded to build an altar and to call its name Yehowah-nissi. (Exodus 17:15) Footnote
