~YOHDH (61)

- The tenth letter of the Hebrew alphabet. It is the smallest of the Hebrew letters. The name of the smallest letter of the Greek alphabet, *i-o'ta*, evidently is akin to the Hebrew *yohdh*.
- Since the Law of Moses was originally written and subsequently preserved in Hebrew, it is likely that Jesus was referring back to the Hebrew *yohdh* when he said that the smallest letter, Greek, *i-o'ta*, would not pass away without its due fulfillment.
- For truly I say to you that sooner would heaven and earth pass away than for one smallest letter or one particle of a letter to pass away from the Law by any means and not all things take place. (Matthew 5:18)
- This letter occurs as the initial letter in the Tetragrammaton, or sacred name Yehowah, reading from right to left: and as such was carried over into the earliest copies of the Greek Septuagint.
- A papyrus fragment of the Third Century C.E. [P. Oxyrhynchus vii. 1007] containing a portion of the Septuagint translation of Genesis represented the divine name Yehowah by a doubled *yohdh*.
- Further, Yehowah God planted a garden in Eden, toward the east, and there he put the man whom he had formed. (Genesis 2:8)
- Because of the similarity between the letters *yohdh* and *waw* they were sometimes confused by copyists. In the Hebrew, at,
- Your own hands have made me, and they proceeded to fix me solidly. Make me understand, that I may learn your commandments. (Psalms 119:73)
- Those fearing you are the ones that see me and rejoice, for I have waited for your own word. (Psalms 119:74)
- I well know, O Yehowah, that your judicial decisions are righteousness and that with faithfulness you have afflicted me. (Psalms 119:75)

- May your loving-kindness serve, please, to comfort me, according to your saying to your servant. (Psalms 119:76)
- Let your mercies come to me, that I may keep living, for your Law is what I am fond of. (Psalms 119:77)
- Let the presumptuous ones be ashamed, for without cause they have misled me. As for me, I concern myself with your orders. (Psalms 119:78)
- Let those fearing you turn back to me, those also knowing your reminders. (Psalms 119:79)
- Let my heart prove faultless in your regulations, in order, that I may not be ashamed. (Psalms 119:80)
- Each verse begins with the letter *yohdh*.
