**(za'yin)**

- The seventh letter in the Hebrew alphabet. It corresponds generally to the **English** letter **z** and, in the **Hebrew**, is found at the beginning of each verse of;
- Remember the word to your servant, for which you have made me wait. (**Psalms 119:49**)
- This is my comfort in my affliction, for your own saying has preserved me alive. (**Psalms 119:50**)
- The presumptuous ones themselves have derided me to the extreme. From your Law I have not deviated. (**Psalms 119:51**)
- I have remembered your judicial decisions from time indefinite, O Yehowah, and I find comfort for myself. (**Psalms 119:52**)
- A raging heat itself has taken hold of me because of the wicked, who are leaving your Law. (**Psalms 119:53**)
- Melodies your regulations have become to me in the house of my alien residences. (**Psalms 119:54**)
- In the night I have remembered your name, O Yehowah, that I may keep your law. (**Psalms 119:55**)
- Even this has become mine, because your orders I have observed. (**Psalms 119:56**)
