- The seventh letter in the Hebrew alphabet. It corresponds generally to the English letter z and, in the Hebrew, is found at the beginning of each verse of;
- Remember the word to your servant, for which you have made me wait. (Psalms 119:49)
- This is my comfort in my affliction, for your own saying has preserved me alive. (Psalms 119:50)
- The presumptuous ones themselves have derided me to the extreme. From your Law I have not deviated. (Psalms 119:51)
- I have remembered your judicial decisions from time indefinite,
 O Yehowah, and I find comfort for myself. (Psalms 119:52)
- A raging heat itself has taken hold of me because of the wicked, who are leaving your Law. (Psalms 119:53)
- Melodies your regulations have become to me in the house of my alien residences. (Psalms 119:54)
- In the night I have remembered your name, O Yehowah, that I may keep your law. (Psalms 119:55)
- Even this has become mine, because your orders I have observed. (Psalms 119:56)
