- Now the Philistines were fighting against Israel, and the men of Israel took to flight from before the Philistines, and they kept falling down slain in Mount **Gilboa**. (**1 Samuel 31:1**)
- And the Philistines, for their part, made war upon Israel, and the men of Israel went fleeing from before the Philistines and kept falling slain in Mount **Gilboa**. (**1 Chronicles 10:1**)
- And if it is some of the field of his possession that a man would sanctify to Yehowah, the value must then be estimated in proportion to its seed; if a homer of barley seed, then at fifty shekels of silver. (**Leviticus 27:16**)
- Let there be a setting of the table in order, an arranging of the location of seats, an eating, a drinking! Get up, **YOU** princes, anoint the **shield**. (**Isaiah 21:5**)
- Subsequently the Philistines collected together and came and pitched camp in Shunem. So **Saul** collected all Israel together and they pitched camp in **Gilboa**. (**1 Samuel 28:4**)
- So David went and took the bones of **Saul** and the bones of Jonathan his son from the landowners of Jabesh-gilead, who had stolen them from the public square of Beth-shan, where the Philistines had hanged them on the day that the Philistines struck down **Saul** on **Gilboa**. (**2 Samuel 21:12**)
- And out of Benjamin there was the valiant, **mighty** man Eliada, and with him there were two hundred thousand men equipped with the bow and **shield**. (**2 Chronicles 17:17**)
- Furthermore, he took courage and built up all the broken-down wall and raised towers upon it, and on the outside another wall,

and repaired the Mound of the City of David, and made missiles in abundance and shields. (2 Chronicles 32:5)
