

**2 Samuel 21:7** However, the king felt compassion upon Mephibosheth the son of Jonathan the son of Saul on account of the oath of Yehowah that was between them, between David and Jonathan the son of Saul.

[12] - References:

- Now **Jonathan**, the son of **Saul**, had a son lame in the feet. Five years old he happened to be when the report about **Saul** and **Jonathan** came from Jezreel, and his nurse began to carry him and flee, but it came about that as she was running in panic to flee, he then had a fall and was lamed. And his name was **Mephibosheth**. (**2 Samuel 4:4**)
- And you must cultivate the ground for him, you and your sons and your servants, and you must do the gathering in, and it must serve as food for those belonging to the grandson of your master, and they must eat, but **Mephibosheth** himself, the grandson of your master, will eat bread at my table constantly. Now Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants. (**2 Samuel 9:10**)
- As for **Mephibosheth** the grandson of **Saul**, he came down to meet the king, and he had not attended to his feet nor had he attended to his mustache nor had he washed his garments from the day that the king went away until the day that he came in peace. (**2 Samuel 19:24**)
- And **Jonathan** and **David** proceeded to conclude a covenant, because of his loving him as his own soul. (**1 Samuel 18:3**)
- And **Jonathan** went on to say to **David**; Go in peace, since we have sworn, both of us, in the name of **Yehowah**, saying; 'May **Yehowah** himself prove to be between me and you and between my offspring and your offspring to time indefinite. Accordingly **David** rose up and went his way, and **Jonathan** himself came into the city. (**1 Samuel 20:42**)
- And **Saul** proceeded to choose for himself three thousand men out of Israel, and two thousand came to be with **Saul** at Michmash and in the mountainous region of Bethel, and a thousand proved to be with **Jonathan** at Gibeah of Benjamin, and the rest of the people he sent away, each one to his tent. (**1 Samuel 13:2**)

- **And it came about one day that Jonathan the son of Saul proceeded to say to the attendant carrying his weapons; Do come and let us cross over to the outpost of the Philistines who are across over there. But to his father he did not tell it. (1 Samuel 14:1)**
- **And you will not cut off your own loving-kindness from being with my household to time indefinite. Nor, when Yehowah cuts off the enemies of David, every one from the surface of the ground. (1 Samuel 20:15)**
- **Will the name of Jonathan be cut off from the house of David. And Yehowah must require it at the hand of David's enemies. (1 Samuel 20:16)**
- **Then the two of them concluded a covenant before Yehowah, and David kept dwelling in Horesh, and Jonathan himself went to his own home. (1 Samuel 23:18)**
- **So now do swear to me by Yehowah that you will not cut off my seed after me and that you will not annihilate my name out of the house of my father. (1 Samuel 24:21)**
- **And for the female lamb he should make compensation with four, as a consequence of the fact that he has done this thing and because he did not have compassion. (2 Samuel 12:6)**
