

**1 Kings 12:18**· Subsequently King Rehoboam sent Adoram, who was over those conscripted for forced labor, but all Israel pelted him with stones, so that he died. And King Rehoboam himself managed to get up into the chariot to flee to Jerusalem.

- And Adoram was over those conscripted for forced labor, and Jehoshaphat the son of Ahilud was the recorder. (2 Samuel 20:24)
- And Ahishar was over the household, and Adoniram the son of Abda, over those conscripted for forced labor. (1 Kings 4:6)
- And he would send them to Lebanon in shifts of ten thousand a month. For a month they would continue in Lebanon, for two months at their homes, and Adoniram was over those conscripted for forced labor. (1 Kings 5:14)
- Finally Moses cried out to Yehowah, saying; What shall I do with this people? A little longer and they will stone me! (Exodus 17:4)
- However, all the assembly talked of pelting them with stones. And Yehowah's glory appeared on the tent of meeting to all the sons of Israel. (Numbers 14:10)
- Subsequently King Rehoboam sent Hadoram, who was over those conscripted for forced labor, but the sons of Israel pelted him with stones, so that he died. And King Rehoboam himself managed to get up into his chariot to flee to Jerusalem. (2 Chronicles 10:18)
- Finally they conspired against him and pelted him with stones at the king's commandment in the courtyard of Yehowah's house. (2 Chronicles 24:21)
- Then the captain went off with his officers and proceeded to bring them, but without violence, as they were afraid of being stoned by the people. (Acts of Apostles 5:26)
