

**1 Kings 16:24**· And he proceeded to buy the mountain of Samaria<sup>1</sup> from Shemer for two talents<sup>2</sup> of silver, and began to build on the mountain and call the name of the city that he built by the name of Shemer the master<sup>3</sup> of the mountain, Samaria.

[18] - References:

- As for Ben-hadad the king of Syria, he collected all his military forces together and also thirty-two kings with him and horses and chariots, and he proceeded to go up and lay siege to Samaria and fight against it. (1 Kings 20:1)
- Thus the king died. When he was brought to Samaria, then they buried the king in Samaria. (1 Kings 22:37)
- Subsequently the king of Assyria brought people from Babylon and Cuthah and Avva and Hamath and Sepharvaim and had them dwell in the cities of Samaria instead of the sons of Israel, and they began to take possession of Samaria and to dwell in its cities. (2 Kings 17:24)
- Woe to those who are at ease in Zion and to those trusting in the mountain of Samaria! They are the distinguished ones of the chief part of the nations, and to them the house of Israel have come. (Amos 6:1)
- Philip, for one, went down to the city of Samaria and began to preach the Christ to them. (Acts of Apostles 8:5)
- And as for Ahab the son of Omri, he became king over Israel in the thirty-eighth year of Asa the king of Judah, and Ahab the son of Omri continued to reign over Israel in Samaria twenty-two years. (1 Kings 16:29)
- Pul the king of Assyria came into the land. Consequently Menahem gave Pul a thousand talents of silver, that his hands might prove to be with him to strengthen the kingdom in his own hand. (2 Kings 15:19)

- So Hezekiah the king of Judah sent to the king of Assyria at Lachish, saying; I have sinned. Turn back from against me. Whatever you may impose upon me I shall carry. Accordingly the king of Assyria laid upon Hezekiah the king of Judah three hundred silver talents and thirty gold talents. (2 Kings 18:14)
- And Pharaoh Nechoh got to put him in bonds at Riblah in the land of Hamath, to keep him from reigning in Jerusalem, and then imposed a fine upon the land of a hundred silver talents and a gold talent. (2 Kings 23:33)
- As for the members of the troop whom Amaziah had sent back from going with him to the war, they began making raids upon the cities of Judah, from Samaria clear to Beth-horon, and went striking down three thousand of them and taking a great plunder. (2 Chronicles 25:13)
- Moreover, the sons of Israel took two hundred thousand of their brothers captive, women, sons and daughters, and also a great deal of spoil they took from them as plunder, after which they brought the spoil to Samaria. (2 Chronicles 28:8)
- Then the men that were designated by their names rose up and took hold of the captives, and all their naked ones they clothed from the spoil. So they clothed them and furnished them with sandals and fed them and gave them drink and greased them. Furthermore, in the case of anyone tottering, they gave them transportation on the asses and brought them to Jericho, the city of palm trees, beside their brothers. After that they returned to Samaria. (2 Chronicles 28:15)
- Even to a hundred talents of silver and a hundred cor measures of wheat and a hundred bath measures of wine and a hundred bath measures of oil, and salt without limit. (Ezra 7:22)
- Thus I weighed out into their hand six hundred and fifty talents of silver and a hundred silver utensils worth two talents, and gold a hundred talents. (Ezra 8:26)
- And the head of Ephraim is Samaria, and the head of Samaria is the son of Remaliah. Unless you people have faith, you will in that case not be of long duration. (Isaiah 7:9)
- Then there came men from Shechem, from Shiloh and from Samaria, eighty men with their beards shaved off and with their garments ripped apart and with cuts made upon themselves, and

- there were grain offering and frankincense in their hand to bring to the house of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 41:5**)
- And their **names** were Oholah the older one and Oholibah her sister, and they came to be mine and **began** to give birth to sons and daughters. And as for their **names**, Oholah is **Samaria**, and Oholibah is Jerusalem. (**Ezekiel 23:4**)
