

1 Kings 1:2 So his servants said to him; Let them look for a girl, a virgin, for my lord the king, and she will have to attend upon the king, that she may become his nurse, and she must lie in your bosom, and my lord the king will certainly feel warm.

- Then the king's attendants, his ministers, **said**; Let them seek young women, **virgins**, beautiful in appearance, for the **king**. (**Esther 2:2**)
- Upon that Jehonadab **said** to him; Lie down on your bed and play sick. And your father **will certainly** come to see you, and you **must** say to him; Please, let Tamar my sister come in and give me bread as a patient, and she **will have** to make the bread of consolation under my eyes in order that I may see it, and I shall **have** to eat from her hand. (**2 Samuel 13:5**)
- Accordingly Bath-sheba went in to the **king** in the interior room, and the **king** was very old, and Abishag the Shunammite was waiting upon the **king**. (**1 Kings 1:15**)
- And Naomi proceeded to take the child and to put it in her **bosom**, and she came to be its **nurse**. (**Ruth 4:16**)
- Now Jonathan, the son of Saul, had a son lame in the feet. Five years old he happened to be when the report about Saul and Jonathan came from Jezreel, and his **nurse** began to carry him and flee, but it came about that as she was running in panic to flee, he then had a fall and was lamed. And his name was Mephibosheth. (**2 Samuel 4:4**)
- At this Sarai **said** to Abram; The violence done me be upon you. I myself gave my maidservant over to your **bosom**, and she became aware that she was pregnant, and I began to be despised in her eyes. May Yehowah judge between me and you. (**Genesis 16:5**)
- Moreover, if two **lie** down together, they also **will certainly** get warm, but how can just one keep warm? (**Ecclesiastes 4:11**)
