Luke 14:11 For everyone that exalts himself will be humbled and he that humbles himself will be exalted.

[22] - References

- Because the afflicted people you yourself **will** save, but the haughty eyes you **will** abase. (Psalms 18:27)
- The very haughtiness of earthling man **will** humble him, but he that is humble in spirit **will** take hold of glory. (Proverbs 29:23)
- Whoever **exalts** himself **will** be **humbled**, and whoever **humbles** himself **will** be exalted. (Matthew 23:12)
- However, the undeserved kindness which he gives is greater. Hence it says; God opposes the haughty ones, but he gives undeserved kindness to the humble ones. (James 4:6)
- If you turn to doing good, **will** there not be an exaltation? But if you do not turn to doing good, there is sin crouching at the entrance, and for you is its craving, and **will** you, for your part, get the mastery over it? (Genesis 4:7)
- And he himself passed on ahead of them and proceeded to bow down to the earth seven times until he got near to his brother. (Genesis 33:3)
- In turn he said to him; Excuse me, Yehowah. With what shall I save Israel? Look! My thousand is the least in Manasseh, and I am the smallest in my father's house. (Judges 6:15)
- At this Saul answered and said; Am I not a Benjaminite of the smallest of the tribes of Israel, and my family the most insignificant of all the families of the tribe of Benjamin? So why have you spoken to me a thing like this? (1 Samuel 9:21)

- So the Philistine said to David; Am I a dog, so that you are coming to me with staves? With that the Philistine called down evil upon David by his gods. (**1 Samuel 17:43**)
- At that he prostrated himself and said; What is your servant, that you have turned your face to the dead dog such as I am? (**2 Samuel 9:8**)
- All the while Adonijah the son of Haggith was lifting himself up, saying; I myself am going to rule as king! And he proceeded to have a chariot made for himself with horsemen and fifty men running before him. (**1 Kings 1:5**)
- At that he said; Whether it is for peace that they have come out, **you** should seize them alive, or whether it is for battle that they have come out, alive is how **you** should seize them. (**1 Kings 20:18**)
- At once the king said to Haman; Quickly, take the apparel and the horse, just as you have said, and do that way to Mordecai the Jew who is sitting in the king's gate. Do not let anything go unfulfilled of all that you have spoken. (**Esther 6:10**)
- Better is the one lightly esteemed but having a servant than the one glorifying himself but in want of bread. (**Proverbs 12:9**)
- The fear of Yehowah is a discipline toward wisdom, and before glory there is humility. (**Proverbs 15:33**)
- Before a crash the heart of a man is lofty, and before glory there is humility. (**Proverbs 18:12**)
- Look! The true Lord, Yehowah of armies, is lopping off boughs with a terrible crash, and those tall in growth are being cut down, and the high ones themselves become low. (**Isaiah 10:33**)
- However, down to Sheol you **will** be brought, to the remotest parts of the pit. (**Isaiah 14:15**)
- Therefore this is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said; For the reason that you make your heart like the heart of god. (**Ezekiel 28:6**)
- Therefore, whoever **will** humble himself like this young child is the one that is the greatest in the kingdom of the heavens. (**Matthew 18:4**)
- Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt **you** in due time. (**1 Peter 5:6**)
