

Isaiah 15:5~ My own heart cries out over Moab himself. The runaways thereof are as far along as Zoar and Eglath-shelishiyah. For on the ascent of Luhith, with weeping each one goes up on it, for on the way to Horonaim they arouse the outcry about the catastrophe.

1• What a sad outcome for ones who were once friends of the Greater Abraham, Yehowah God. Their runaways travel far to escape the judgment. They ascend the mountains, governments to tell it out and try to arouse an outcry among the nations, for the catastrophe that has come upon them.

[Question] What sad outcome was there, for ones who were once friends of Abraham?

[Question] Where does their cry get to be heard, but to no effect?

2• There is the sound of an outcry from Horonaim, a despoiling and great breaking down. (Jeremiah 48:3)

[Question] What cry is heard in Horonaim?

3• For on the way up to Luhith it is with weeping that one goes up, there is a weeping. For on the way down from Horonaim there is a distressing outcry over the breakdown that people have heard. (Jeremiah 48:5)

[Question] What weeping is heard before their god?

4• That is why it is over Moab that I shall howl, and for Moab in his entirety I shall cry out. For the men of Kir-heres one shall moan. (Jeremiah 48:31)

[Question] Why would crying and moaning come up?

5• From the cry in Heshbon clear to Elealeh, clear to Jahaz they have given forth their voice, from Zoar clear to Horonaim, to Eglath-shelishiyah, for even the waters of Nimrim themselves will become mere desolations. (Jeremiah 48:34)

[Question] What would become of her land, clear from one end to the other?

6• So Lot raised his eyes and saw the whole District of the Jordan, that all of it was a wellwatered region before Yehowah brought Sodom and Gomorrah to ruin, like the

**garden of Yehowah, like the land of Egypt as far as Zoar.
(Genesis 13:10)**

[Question] What kind of a land was this area, East of the Jordan, before God brought Sodom to ruin?

7· Hurry! Escape there, because I am not able to do a thing until your arriving there! That is why he called the name of the city Zoar. (Genesis 19:22)
