- Also, there will be signs in sun and moon and stars, and on the earth anguish of nations, not knowing the way out because of the roaring of the sea and its agitation. (**Luke 21:25**)
- While men **become** faint out of fear and expectation of the things coming upon the inhabited earth, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. (**Luke 21:26**)
- And then they will see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. (**Luke 21:27**)
- You kept on looking until a stone was cut out not by hands, and it struck the image on its **feet** of iron and of molded clay and crushed them. (**Daniel 2:34**)
- At that time the iron, the molded clay, the copper, the silver and the gold were, all together, crushed and became like the chaff from the summer threshing floor, and the wind carried them away so that no trace at all was found of them. And as for the stone that struck the image, it became a large mountain and filled the whole earth. (**Daniel 2:35**)
- And in the days of those kings the **God** of heaven will set up a kingdom that will never be brought to ruin. And the kingdom itself will not be passed on to any other people. It will crush and put an end to all these kingdoms, and it itself will stand to times indefinite. (**Daniel 2:44**)

- And this **Good News** of the kingdom will be preached in all the inhabited earth for a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come. (**Matthew 24:14**)
- However, Moses in answering said; But suppose they do not believe me and do not listen to my voice, because they are going to say, Yehowah did not appear to you. (**Exodus 4:1**)
- Then Yehowah said to him; What is that in your hand? To which he said; A rod. (**Exodus 4:2**)
- Next he said; Throw it on the earth. So he threw it on the earth, and it became a serpent, and Moses began to flee from it. (**Exodus 4:3**)
- Yehowah now said to Moses; Thrust your hand out and grab hold of it by the tail. So he thrust his hand out and grabbed hold of it, and it became a rod in his palm. (**Exodus 4:4**)
- In order that, to quote him, they may believe that Yehowah the **God** of their forefathers, the **God** of Abraham, the **God** of Isaac and the **God** of Jacob, **has** appeared to you. (**Exodus 4:5**)
- Then Yehowah said to him once more; Stick your hand, please, into the upper fold of your garment. So he stuck his hand into the upper fold of his garment. When he drew it out, why, here his hand was stricken with leprosy like snow! (**Exodus 4:6**)
- After that he said; Return your hand into the upper fold of your garment. So he returned his hand into the upper fold of his garment. When he drew it out of the upper fold of his garment, why, here it was restored like the rest of his flesh! (**Exodus 4:7**)
- And it must occur that, to quote him, if they will not believe you and will not listen to the voice of the first sign, then they will certainly believe the voice of the later sign. (**Exodus 4:8**)
- Still, it must occur that, if they will not believe even these two signs and will not listen to your voice, then you will have to take some water from the Nile River and pour it out on the dry land, and the water that you will take from the Nile River will certainly **become**, yes, it will indeed **become** blood on the dry land. (**Exodus 4:9**)
- Moses now said to Yehowah; Excuse me, Yehowah, but I am not a fluent speaker, neither since yesterday nor since before that nor since your speaking to your servant, for I am slow of mouth and slow of tongue. (**Exodus 4:10**)

- At that Yehowah said to him; Who appointed a mouth for man or who appoints the speechless or the deaf or the clear-sighted or the blind? Is it not I, Yehowah? (**Exodus 4:11**)
- So now go, and I myself shall prove to be with your mouth and I will teach you what you ought to say. (**Exodus 4:12**)
- But he said; Excuse me, Yehowah, but send, please, by the hand of the one whom you are going to send. (**Exodus 4:13**)
- Then Yehowah's anger grew hot against Moses and he said; Is not Aaron the Levite your brother? I do know that he can really speak. And, besides, here he is on his way out to meet you. When he does see you, he will certainly rejoice in his heart. (**Exodus 4:14**)
- And you must speak to him and put the words in his mouth, and I myself shall prove to be with your mouth and his mouth, and I will teach **you** men what **you** are to do. (**Exodus 4:15**)
- And he must speak for you to the people, and it must occur that he will serve as a mouth to you, and you will serve as **God** to him. (**Exodus 4:16**)
- And this rod you will take in your hand that you may perform the signs with it. (**Exodus 4:17**)
- And the seventh angel blew his trumpet. And loud voices occurred in heaven, **saying**; The kingdom of the world did **become** the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he will rule as king forever and ever. (**Revelation 11:15**)
- And the twenty-four elders who were seated before **God** upon their thrones fell upon their faces and worshiped **God**. (**Revelation 11:16**)
- Saying; We thank you, Yehowah **God**, the Almighty, the One who is and who was, because you have taken your great power and begun ruling as king. (**Revelation 11:17**)
- Make your way up even onto a high mountain, you woman **bringing Good News** for **Zion**. Raise your voice even with power, you woman **bringing Good News** for Jerusalem. Raise it. Do not be afraid. Say to the cities of Judah; Here is **YOUR** God. (**Isaiah 40:9**)
- And with **YOUR** **feet** shod with the equipment of the **Good News** of **peace**. (**Ephesians 6:15**)

- Yehowah himself gives the **saying**, the women telling the **Good News** are a large army. (**Psalms 68:11**)
- Look! Upon the **mountains** the **feet** of one **bringing Good News**, one **publishing peace**. O Judah, celebrate your festivals. Pay your vows, because no more will any good-for-nothing person pass again through you. In his entirety he will certainly be cut off. (**Nahum 1:15**)
- How, in turn, will they preach unless they have been sent forth? Just as it is written; How comely are the **feet** of those who declare **Good News** of **good** things! (**Romans 10:15**)
- Glory in the heights above to **God**, and upon earth **peace** among men of goodwill. (**Luke 2:14**)
- However, those who had been scattered went through the land declaring the **Good News** of the word. (**Acts of Apostles 8:4**)
- He sent out the word to the sons of Israel to declare to them the **Good News** of **peace** through Jesus Christ; this One is Lord of all others. (**Acts of Apostles 10:36**)
- Now the Scripture, seeing in advance that **God** would declare people of the nations righteous due to faith, declared the **Good News** beforehand to Abraham, namely; By means of you all the nations will be blessed. (**Galatians 3:8**)
- And he came and declared the **Good News** of **peace** to **you**, the ones far off, and **peace** to those near. (**Ephesians 2:17**)
- And this **Good News** of the kingdom will be preached in all the inhabited earth for a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come. (**Matthew 24:14**)
- And I saw another angel flying in midheaven, and he had everlasting **Good News** to declare as glad tidings to those who dwell on the earth, and to every nation and tribe and tongue and people. (**Revelation 14:6**)
- For he says; In an acceptable time I heard you, and in a day of **salvation** I helped you. Look! Now is the especially acceptable time. Look! Now is the day of **salvation**. (**2 Corinthians 6:2**)
- And they keep on crying with a loud voice, **saying**; Salvation we owe to our **God**, who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb. (**Revelation 7:10**)

- And he came to be king in Jeshurun, when the heads of the people gathered themselves, the entire number of the tribes of Israel. **(Deuteronomy 33:5)**
- Yehowah himself **has become** king! With eminence he is clothed, Yehowah is clothed, with strength he **has** girded himself. The productive land also **becomes** firmly established so that it cannot be made to totter. **(Psalms 93:1)**
- For Yehowah is our Judge, Yehowah is our Statute-giver, Yehowah is our King, he himself will save us. **(Isaiah 33:22)**
- And I shall certainly make her that was limping a remnant, and her that was removed far off a mighty nation, and Yehowah will actually rule as king over them in Mount **Zion**, from now on and into time indefinite. **(Micah 4:7)**
- Saying; We thank you, Yehowah **God**, the Almighty, the One who is and who was, because you have taken your great power and begun ruling as king. **(Revelation 11:17)**
- Let the **mountains** carry **peace** to the people, also the hills, through righteousness. **(Psalms 72:3)**
- Sing to Yehowah, bless his name. From day to day tell the **Good News** of **salvation** by him. **(Psalms 96:2)**
- As cold water upon a tired soul, so is a **good** report from a distant land. **(Proverbs 25:25)**
- How beautiful your steps have **become** in your sandals, O willing daughter! The curvings of your thighs are like ornaments, the work of an artisan's hands. **(Song of Solomon 7:1)**
- There is one first, **saying** to **Zion**; Look! Here they are! And to Jerusalem I shall give a bringer of **Good News**. **(Isaiah 41:27)**
- My righteousness is near. My **salvation** will certainly go forth, and my own arms will judge even the peoples. In me the islands themselves will hope, and for my arm they will wait. **(Isaiah 51:5)**
- And I went on to clothe you with an embroidered garment and to shoe you with sealskin and to wrap you in fine linen and to cover you with costly material. **(Ezekiel 16:10)**
- And I heard what was as a voice of a great crowd and as a sound of many waters and as a sound of heavy thunders. They said; Praise
