HEARER OF PRAYER - TO YOU ALL PEOPLES WILL COME

Yehowah … Qualities … Hearer Of Prayer - O, Hearer of prayer to you all peoples will come (Psalms 65:2) [35] - References

Psalms 65:2... O Hearer of prayer, even to you people of all flesh will come.

[35] - References

- Yehowah is near to all those calling upon him, to all those who call upon him in trueness. (Psalms 145:18)
- And it will certainly occur that from new moon to new moon and from Sabbath to Sabbath all flesh will come in to bow down before me, Yehowah has said. (Isaiah 66:23)
- And said; Cornelius, your prayer has been favorably heard and your gifts of mercy have been remembered before God. (Acts of Apostles 10:31)
- In order that those who remain of the men may earnestly seek Yehowah, together with people of all the nations, people who are called by my name, says Yehowah, who is doing these things. (Acts of Apostles 15:17)
- And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that, no matter what it is that we ask according to his will, he hears us. (1 John 5:14)
- Well, it came about that before he had finished speaking, why, here coming out was Rebekah, who had been born to Bethuel the son of Milcah the wife of Nahor, Abraham's brother, and her water jar was upon her shoulder. (Genesis 24:15)
- Before I was finished speaking in my heart, why, there was Rebekah coming out, with her jar upon her shoulder, and she made her way down to the fountain and began to draw water. Then I said to her, Give me a drink, please. (Genesis 24:45)
- And God heard and answered Leah and she became pregnant and in time bore to Jacob a fifth son. (Genesis 30:17)

- So Yehowah did according to Moses' word, and the gadflies turned away from Pharaoh, his servants and his people. Not one was left. (Exodus 8:31)
- Accordingly the true God listened to the voice of Manoah, and the angel of the true God came again to the woman while she was sitting in the field, and Manoah her husband was not with her. (Judges 13:9)
- And she was bitter of soul, and she began to pray to Yehowah and to weep greatly. (1 Samuel 1:10)
- Then Eli answered and said; Go in peace, and may the God of Israel grant your petition that you have asked of him. (1 Samuel 1:17)
- And Yehowah went on to say to him; I have heard your prayer and your request for favor with which you requested favor before me. I have sanctified this house that you have built by putting my name there to time indefinite, and my eyes and my heart will certainly prove to be there always. (1 Kings 9:3)
- Finally Yehowah listened to Elijah's voice, so that the soul of the child came back within him and he came to life. (1 Kings 17:22)
- In time Jehoahaz softened the face of Yehowah, so that Yehowah listened to him, for he had seen the oppression upon Israel, because the king of Syria had oppressed them. (2 Kings 13:4)
- Perhaps Yehowah your God will hear all the words of Rabshakeh, whom the king of Assyria his lord sent to taunt the living God, and he will actually call him to account for the words that Yehowah your God has heard. And you must lift up prayer in behalf of the remnant that are to be found. (2 Kings 19:4)
- Incline your ear, O Yehowah, and hear. Open your eyes, O Yehowah, and see, and hear the words of Sennacherib that he has sent to taunt the living God. (2 Kings 19:16)
- Go back, and you must say to Hezekiah the leader of my people, This is what Yehowah the God of David your forefather has said; I have heard your prayer. I have seen your tears. Here I am healing you. On the third day you will go up to the house of Yehowah. (2 Kings 20:5)
- And you must turn toward the prayer of your servant and to his request for favor, O Yehowah my God, by listening to the entreating cry and to the prayer with which your servant is praying before you. (2 Chronicles 6:19)

- Now, O my God, please, let your eyes prove to be opened and your ears attentive to the prayer respecting this place. (2 Chronicles 6:40)
- So you saw the affliction of our forefathers in Egypt, and their outcry at the Red Sea you heard. (Nehemiah 9:9)
- To confirm these days of Purim at their appointed times, just as Mordecai the Jew and Esther the queen had imposed upon them, and just as they had imposed upon their own soul and upon their offspring, the matters of the fasts and their cry for aid. (Esther 9:31)
- You will make entreaty to him, and he will hear you, and your vows you will pay. (Job 22:27)
- To my sayings do give ear, O Yehowah, do understand my sighing. (Psalms 5:1)
- Do pay attention to the sound of my cry for help, O my King and my God, because to you I pray. (Psalms 5:2)
- On this account every loyal one will pray to you at such a time only as you may be found. As for the flood of many waters, they will not touch him himself. (Psalms 32:6)
- O God, hear my prayer, do give ear to the sayings of my mouth. (Psalms 54:2)
- Truly God has heard, he has paid attention to the voice of my prayer. (Psalms 66:19)
- O do hear my own voice according to your loving-kindness. O Yehowah, according to your judicial decision preserve me alive. (Psalms 119:149)
- O Yehowah, do hear my voice. May your ears prove to be attentive to the voice of my entreaties. (Psalms 130:2)
- O Yehowah, hear my prayer, do give ear to my entreaty. In your faithfulness answer me in your righteousness. (Psalms 143:1)
- Incline your ear, O Yehowah, and hear. Open your eyes, O Yehowah, and see, and hear all the words of Sennacherib that he has sent to taunt the living God. (Isaiah 37:17)
- And they proceeded to call out to Yehowah and to say; Ah, now, O Yehowah, may we, please, not perish because of the soul of this man! And do not put upon us innocent blood, since you yourself, O

Yehowah, have done according to what you have delighted in! (Jonah 1:14)

- But as for me, it is for Yehowah that I shall keep on the lookout. I will show a waiting attitude for the God of my salvation. My God will hear me. (Micah 7:7)
