- These, therefore, approached Philip who was from **Bethsaida** of Galilee, and they began to request him, saying; Sir, we want to see Jesus. **(John 12:21)**
- And I proceeded to set my face to Yehowah the true God, in order to seek him with prayer and with entreaties, with fasting and **sackcloth** and **ashes**. **(Daniel 9:3)**
- When the word reached the king of Nineveh, then he rose up from his throne and put off his official garment from himself and covered himself with **sackcloth** and sat down in the **ashes**. **(Jonah 3:6)**
- **Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida!** Because if the **powerful works** that **have taken place** in you had **taken place** in Tyre and Sidon, they would long ago have repented sitting in **sackcloth** and **ashes**. **(Luke 10:13)**
- And to Ebron and Rehob and Hammon and Kanah as far as populous **Sidon**. **(Joshua 19:28)**
- And Mordecai himself got knowledge of everything that had been done, and Mordecai proceeded to rip his garments apart and put on **sackcloth** and **ashes** and go out into the middle of the city and cry out with a loud and bitter outcry. **(Esther 4:1)**
- In its streets they **have girded on sackcloth**. Upon the roofs thereof and in the public squares thereof everyone thereof howls, going down with weeping. **(Isaiah 15:3)**

- And it came about that as soon as King Hezekiah heard, he immediately ripped his garments apart and covered himself with **sackcloth** and came into the house of Yehowah. (**Isaiah 37:1**)
- Not to numerous peoples unintelligible in language or heavy in tongue, whose words you cannot hear understandingly. If it was to them that I had sent you, those very ones would listen to you. (**Ezekiel 3:6**)
- Even from Jerusalem and from Idumea and from across the Jordan and around **Tyre** and **Sidon**, a great multitude, on hearing of how many things he was doing, came to him. (**Mark 3:8**)
- From there he rose up and went into the regions of **Tyre** and **Sidon**. And he entered into a house and did not want anyone to get to know it. Yet he could not escape notice. (**Mark 7:24**)
- If I had not come and spoken to them, they would **have** no sin, but now they **have** no excuse for their sin. (**John 15:22**)
