

James 1:4~ But let endurance have its work complete, that you may be complete and sound in all respects, not lacking in anything.

1· James then encourages his anointed Christian brothers to let this work run its course to completion, for the end result will be, that they will then be sound and complete before their God in all respects. When they reach the end of their earthly lives they must appear before the person of Yehowah God for judgment by him, and they must have completed this work by then.

[Question] What counsel does James now give to his spirit anointed brothers, for what will it result in?

[Question] Who will each one of them have to stand before, at the end of their earthly lives?

2· **You** must accordingly be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect. (**Matthew 5:48**)

[Question] What must all anointed sons of God achieve to?

3· Brothers, do not become young children in powers of understanding, but be babes as to badness, yet become full-grown in powers of understanding. (**1 Corinthians 14:20**)

[Question] What spiritual power should anointed Christians not become babes regarding?

[Question] What should they be babes as to?

4· Until we all attain to the oneness in the faith and in the accurate knowledge of the Son of God, to a full-grown man, to the measure of stature that belongs to the fullness of the Christ. (**Ephesians 4:13**)

[Question] What measure of stature do all anointed Christians want to attain to?

5· But speaking the truth, let us by love grow up in all things into him who is the head, Christ. (**Ephesians 4:15**)

[Question] How can anointed Christians grow up into the head, the Christ?

6· So that you may be walking decently as regards people outside and not be needing **anything**. (**1 Thessalonians**

4:12)

[Question] How should anointed Christians walk each day as regards people on the outside of Christianity?

7· Look! We pronounce happy those who **have endured. You **have** heard of the **endurance** of Job and **have** seen the outcome Yehowah gave, that Yehowah is very tender in affection and merciful. (**James 5:11**)**

[Question] What does James show about those who have endured tribulation and stress, and whose example does he use to illustrate this?
