

**James 2:11~** For he who said: **You must not commit adultery**. Said also: **You must not murder**. If, now, you do not commit adultery but you do murder, you have become a transgressor of Law.

1· James now reasons that if we keep all the Law, but transgress in one point, then we are a transgressor of Law, and not a keeper of it. He reasons, that if we refrain from adultery, but then commit murder, then we are simply transgressors against the Law.

**[Question]** What does a man who transgresses in only one point of the Law, become?

2· You must not commit adultery. (**Exodus 20:14**)

**[Question]** Is it wrong to commit adultery?

3· You must not murder. (**Deuteronomy 5:17**)

**[Question]** If is wrong to murder another man?

4· And to the girl you must do nothing. The girl has no sin deserving of death, because just as when a man rises up against his fellowman and indeed murders him, even a soul, so it is with this case. (**Deuteronomy 22:26**)

**[Question]** Why would a woman who was raped in a desolate area suffer no reproach, and yet the man who did it, would have to die?
