

**1 John 1:9** If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous so as to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

[19] - References:

- And it must occur that in case he becomes guilty as respects one of these things, then he must confess in what way he has sinned. (**Leviticus 5:5**)
- My sin I finally confessed to you, and my error I did not cover. I said; I shall make confession over my transgressions to Yehowah. And you yourself pardoned the error of my sins. (**Psalms 32:5**)
- He that is covering over his transgressions will not succeed, but he that is confessing and leaving them will be shown mercy. (**Proverbs 28:13**)
- Therefore openly confess **YOUR sins** to one another and pray for one another, that **YOU** may get healed. A **righteous** man's supplication, when it is at work, has much force. (**James 5:16**)
- Therefore, since we have these promises, beloved ones, let us **cleanse** ourselves of every defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in God's fear. (**2 Corinthians 7:1**)
- Who gave himself for us that he might deliver us from every sort of lawlessness and **cleanse** for himself a people peculiarly his own, zealous for fine works. (**Titus 2:14**)
- Preserving loving-kindness for thousands, pardoning error and transgression and sin, but by no means will he give exemption from punishment, bringing punishment for the error of fathers upon sons and upon grandsons, upon the third generation and upon the fourth generation. (**Exodus 34:7**)

  - **He will sing to men and say, I have sinned, and what is upright I have perverted, and it certainly was not the proper thing for me. (Job 33:27)**
  - **We do acknowledge, O Yehowah, our wickedness, the error of our forefathers, for we have sinned against you. (Jeremiah 14:20)**
  - **Therefore the slave fell down and began to do obeisance to him, saying, Be patient with me and I will pay back everything to you. (Matthew 18:26)**
  - **I will rise and journey to my father and say to him; Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. (Luke 15:18)**
  - **Every branch in me not bearing fruit he takes away, and every one bearing fruit he cleans, that it may bear more fruit. (John 15:2)**
  - **So as to exhibit his own righteousness in this present season, that he might be righteous even when declaring righteous the man that has faith in Jesus. (Romans 3:26)**
  - **For sadness in a godly way makes for repentance to salvation that is not to be regretted, but the sadness of the world produces death. (2 Corinthians 7:10)**
  - **If anyone catches sight of his brother sinning a sin that does not incur death, he will ask, and he will give life to him, yes, to those not sinning so as to incur death. There is a sin that does incur**

**death. It is concerning that sin that I do not tell him to make request. (1 John 5:16)**
