

~**GIVER (50)**

[English, donor, contributor, philanthropist, benefactor, provider, supplier, Opposite of, recipient]

- Yehowah God is the **giver** of power to men to make wealth.
- And you must remember Yehowah your God, because he is the **giver** of power to you to make wealth, in order to carry out his covenant that he swore to your forefathers, as at this day. (**Deuteronomy 8:18**)
- The true God Yehowah is the **giver** of acts of vengeance.
- The true God is the **Giver** of acts of vengeance to me and the One bringing the peoples down under me. (**2 Samuel 22:48**)
- The true God is the **Giver** of acts of vengeance to me, and he subdues the peoples under me. (**Psalms 18:47**)
- Hiram became a **giver** of timbers for the construction of the temple.
- So Hiram became a **giver** of timbers of cedar trees and timbers of juniper trees to Solomon according to all his delight. (**1 Kings 5:10**)
- Yehowah now calls to our mind, the reliableness of all of his statutes, such as the ones that control the Sun, Moon, Stars and the ocean's waves. The sun comes up every day, the Moon and Stars light up the nights, and the ocean waters stay on place. We can also rely on Yehowah's New Covenant, coming true in all of its promise.
- This is what Yehowah, the **Giver** of the sun for light by day, the statutes of the moon and the stars for light by night, the One stirring up the sea that its waves may become boisterous, the One whose name is Yehowah of armies, has said. (**Jeremiah 31:35**)
- Paul is not trying to change their thinking, and get them to do something, that they do not want to do, or that they cannot afford to do. He wants them to do, just as they have resolved to do in their hearts, from the moment that they first heard of the need to give to

those in Jerusalem. Such giving should never be done grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver, who is like himself.
