

## ~REASONED (32)

[English, logical, rational, sound, consistent, articulate, lucid, Opposite of, illogical]

- The woman asked why they had **reasoned** this way against the people of God.
- And the woman went on to say; Why, then, have you **reasoned** like this against the people of God? As the king is speaking this word he is like one that is guilty, in that the king does not bring back his own banished one. (2 Samuel 14:13)
- So according to the custom of Paul, upon entering new territory, he entered into the synagogue of the Jews, as it was here, that he would likely find the most people interested in the worship of Yehowah God. There he **reasoned** with the Jews gathered together there from the scriptures for three Sabbaths.
- So according to Paul's custom he went inside to them, and for three Sabbaths he **reasoned** with them from the Scriptures. (Acts of Apostles 17:2)
- So they sailed off together to Ephesus, and there they left Paul to go their way. Paul though entered into the synagogue of the Jews, and **reasoned** with the Jews there.
- So they arrived at Ephesus, and he left them there, but he himself entered into the synagogue and **reasoned** with the Jews. (Acts of Apostles 18:19)
