

Ecclesiastes 10:12· The words of the mouth of the wise one mean favor, but the lips of the stupid one swallow him up.

[18] - References:

- Happy are your men, happy are these servants of yours who are standing before you constantly, listening to your wisdom! (**1 Kings 10:8**)
- Anyone stumbling, your words would raise up, and knees giving way you would make firm. (**Job 4:4**)
- The **mouth** of the righteous is the one that utters wisdom in an undertone, and his is the tongue that speaks justly. (**Psalms 37:30**)
- The very **lips** of the righteous one keep pasturing many, but for want of heart the foolish themselves keep dying. (**Proverbs 10:21**)
- And they all began to give favorable witness about him and to marvel at the winsome words proceeding out of his **mouth**, and they were saying; This is a son of Joseph, is it not? (**Luke 4:22**)
- Let a rotten saying not proceed out of **YOUR mouth**, but whatever saying is good for building up as the need may be, that it may impart what is favorable to the hearers. (**Ephesians 4:29**)
- And they cause one to stumble. But their tongue is against their own selves. All those looking upon them will shake their head. (**Psalms 64:8**)
- The wise are the ones that treasure up knowledge, but the **mouth** of the foolish one is near to ruin itself. (**Proverbs 10:14**)
- The rod of haughtiness is in the **mouth** of the foolish one, but the very **lips** of the wise ones will guard them. (**Proverbs 14:3**)
- Then they would say to him; Please say Shibboleth. And he would say; Sibboleth, as he was unable to say the word correctly. And they would lay hold of him and slay him at the fords of the Jordan. So there fell at that time forty-two thousand out of Ephraim. (**Judges 12:6**)

- **And the king began to answer the people harshly, and to leave the counsel of the older men who had counseled him. (1 Kings 12:13)**
- **My own mouth will speak things of wisdom, and the meditation of my heart will be of things of understanding. (Psalms 49:3)**
- **The one wise in heart will accept commandments, but the one foolish with his lips will be trodden down. (Proverbs 10:8)**
- **The tongue of wise ones does good with knowledge, but the mouth of the stupid ones bubbles forth with foolishness. (Proverbs 15:2)**
- **He that is crooked at heart will not find good, and he that is turned around in his tongue will fall into calamity. (Proverbs 17:20)**
- **The mouth of the stupid one is the ruin of him, and his lips are a snare for his soul. (Proverbs 18:7)**
- **Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and he that is loving it will eat its fruitage. (Proverbs 18:21)**
- **Whenever you vow a vow to God, do not hesitate to pay it, for there is no delight in the stupid ones. What you vow, pay. (Ecclesiastes 5:4)**
