- As regards the house of his where he was to dwell, at the other courtyard, it was away from the house belonging to the Porch. It proved to be like this in workmanship. And there was a house like this Porch that he proceeded to build for Pharaoh's daughter, whom Solomon had taken. (**1 Kings 7:8**)
- And Solomon went on to build Gezer and Lower Beth-horon. (**1 Kings 9:17**)
- And King Solomon went on to make two hundred large shields of alloyed gold, six hundred shekels of alloyed gold he proceeded to lay upon each large shield. (**2 Chronicles 9:15**)
- For fear that you may eat and indeed satisfy yourself, and you may build good houses and indeed dwell in them. (**Deuteronomy 8:12**)
- And his own house Solomon built in thirteen years, so that he finished all his own house. (**1 Kings 7:1**)
- Their inward wish is that their houses may be to time indefinite, their tabernacles to generation after generation. They have called their landed estates by their names. (**Psalms 49:11**)
- And Judah and Israel continued to dwell in security, everyone under his own vine and under his own fig tree, from Dan to Beer-sheba, all the days of Solomon. (**1 Kings 4:25**)
- There was a vineyard that Solomon happened to have in Baal-hamon. He gave the vineyard over to the keepers. Each one would bring in for its fruitage a thousand silver pieces. (**Song of Solomon 8:11**)
- And it came about that, as soon as Solomon had finished building the house of Yehowah and the house of the king and every desirable thing of Solomon that he took delight in making. (**1 Kings 9:1**)
- Thus Solomon finished the house of Yehowah and the house of the king, and in everything that had come into Solomon's heart

to do regarding the house of Yehowah and his own house he proved successful. (2 Chronicles 7:11)

- **And I, even I, hated all my hard work at which I was working hard under the sun, that I would leave behind for the man who would come to be after me. (Ecclesiastes 2:18)**
