Ecclesiastes 5:10... A mere lover of silver will not be satisfied with silver, neither any lover of wealth with income.¹ This too is vanity.

Footnote: Literally, and who is setting his love on wealthiness with no income (revenue)?

- There exists one, but not a second one, also no son or brother does he have, but there is no end to all his hard work. Also, his eyes themselves are not satisfied with riches; And for whom am I working hard and causing my soul to lack in good things? This too is vanity, and it is a calamitous occupation. (Ecclesiastes 4:8)
- No one can slave for two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will stick to the one and despise the other. you cannot slave for God and for Riches. (Matthew 6:24)
- Then he said to them; Keep YOUR eyes open and guard against every sort of covetousness, because even when a person has an abundance his life does not result from the things he possesses. (Luke 12:15)
- For the love of money is a root of all sorts of injurious things, and by reaching out for this love some have been led astray from the faith and have stabbed themselves all over with many pains. (1 Timothy 6:10)
- And I, even I, turned toward all the works of mine that my hands had done and toward the hard work that I had worked hard to accomplish, and, look! Everything was vanity and a striving after wind, and there was nothing of advantage under the sun. (Ecclesiastes 2:11)
- And, indeed, because the wine is dealing treacherously, an ablebodied man is self-assuming, and he will not reach his goal, he who has made his soul spacious just like Sheol, and who is like death and cannot be satisfied. And he keeps gathering to himself all the nations and collecting together to himself all the peoples. (Habakkuk 2:5)
 - Yes, the fine fruit that your soul desired has departed from you, and all the dainty things and the gorgeous things have perished from you, and never again will people find them. (Revelation 18:14)

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
