For there is no delight in the stupid ones. What you vow, pay.

[31] - References:

- In case you vow a vow to Yehowah your God, you must not be slow about paying it, because Yehowah your God will without fail require it of you, and it would indeed become a sin on your part. (Deuteronomy 23:21)
- Offer thanksgiving as your sacrifice to God, and pay to the Most High your vows. (Psalms 50:14)
- Vow and pay to Yehowah Your God, all You who are round about him. Let them bring a gift in fear. (Psalms 76:11)
- And Yehowah will certainly become known to the Egyptians, and the Egyptians must know Yehowah in that day, and they must render sacrifice and gift and must make a vow to Yehowah and pay it. (Isaiah 19:21)
- Again You heard that it was said to those of ancient times: You must not swear without performing, but you must pay your vows to Yehowah. (Matthew 5:33)
- The words of the mouth of the wise one mean favor, but the lips of the stupid one swallow him up. (Ecclesiastes 10:12)
- In case a man makes a vow to Yehowah or swears an oath to bind a vow of abstinence upon his soul, he must not violate his word. According to all that has gone out of his mouth he should do. (Numbers 30:2)
- I shall come into your house with whole burnt offerings, I shall pay to you my vows (Psalms 66:13)
- My vows I shall pay to Yehowah, yes, in front of all his people.(Psalms 116:18)
- But as for me, with the voice of thanksgiving I will sacrifice to you. What I have vowed, I will pay. Salvation belongs to Yehowah. (Jonah 2:9)
- And Jacob went on to vow a vow, saying; If God will continue with me and will certainly keep me on this way on which I am

- going and will certainly give me bread to eat and garments to wear (Genesis 28:20)
- I am the true God of Bethel, where you anointed a pillar and where you vowed a vow to me. Now get up, go out of this land and return to the land of your birth. (Genesis 31:13)
- And if the sacrifice of his offering is a vow or a voluntary offering, it is to be eaten on the day of his presenting his sacrifice, and on the next day what is left of it also may be eaten. (Leviticus 7:16)
- And in case a man should present a communion sacrifice to Yehowah in order to pay a vow or as a voluntary offering, it should prove to be a sound one among the herd or the flock, in order to gain approval. No defect at all should prove to be in it. (Leviticus 22:21)
- And Yehowah continued to speak to Moses, saying; (Leviticus 27:1)
- Now this is the Law about the Nazirite. On the day that the days of his Naziriteship come to the full, he will be brought to the entrance of the tent of meeting. (Numbers 6:13)
- At this all the chieftains said to all the assembly; We, for our part, have sworn to them by Yehowah the God of Israel, and now we are not allowed to hurt them. (Joshua 9:19)
- At this Joshua said to the people; You are witnesses against yourselves that You of Your own accord have chosen Yehowah for yourselves, to serve him. To this they said; We are witnesses. (Joshua 24:22)
- Then Jephthah made a vow to Yehowah and said; If you without fail give the sons of Ammon into my hand. (Judges 11:30)
- And she went on to make a vow and say; O Yehowah of armies, if you will without fail look upon the affliction of your slave girl and actually remember me, and you will not forget your slave girl and actually give to your slave girl a male offspring, I will give him to Yehowah all the days of his life, and no razor will come upon his head. (1 Samuel 1:11)
- And the king proceeded to swear and say; As Yehowah is living who redeemed my soul out of all distress. (1 Kings 1:29)

- To this all the congregation answered and said with a loud voice; Exactly according to your word it devolves upon us to do. (Ezra 10:12)
- They were adhering to their brothers, their majestic ones, and coming into liability to a curse and into an oath, to walk in the Law of the true God, which had been given by the hand of Moses the servant of the true God, and to keep and to perform all the commandments of Yehowah our Lord and his judicial decisions and his regulations. (Nehemiah 10:29)
- You will make entreaty to him, and he will hear you, and your vows you will pay. (Job 22:27)
- From you my praise will be in the large congregation, my vows I shall pay in front of those fearing him. (Psalms 22:25)
- Upon me, O God, there are vows to you. I shall render expressions of thanksgiving to you. (Psalms 56:12)
- So I will make melody to your name forever, that I may pay my vows day after day. (Psalms 61:8)
- For you there is praise, silence, O God, in Zion, and to you the vow will be paid. (Psalms 65:1)
- It is a snare when earthling man has rashly cried out, Holy! And after vows he is disposed to make examination. (Proverbs 20:25)
- But they said; We shall drink no wine, because Jonadab the son of Rechab, our forefather, was the one that laid the command upon us, saying, you must drink no wine, neither you nor your sons, to time indefinite. (Jeremiah 35:6)
- But Peter said; Ananias, why has Satan emboldened you to play false to the Holy Spirit and to hold back secretly some of the price of the field? (Acts of Apostles 5:3)
