- For the king had a fleet of ships of **Tarshish** on the sea along with Hiram's fleet of ships. Once every three years the fleet of ships of **Tarshish** would come carrying **gold** and silver, ivory, and apes and peacocks. (**1 Kings 10:22**)
- For ships belonging to the king were going to **Tarshish** with the servants of Hiram. Once every three years ships of **Tarshish** would come in, carrying **gold** and silver, ivory, and apes and peacocks. (**2 Chronicles 9:21**)
- I also proceeded to raise my eyes and see, and here was a certain man clothed in linen, with his hips girded with **gold** of **Uphaz**. (**Daniel 10:5**)
- Their idols are silver and **gold**, the work of the **hands** of earthling man. (**Psalms 115:4**)
- And the weight of the nose rings of **gold** that he had requested amounted to one thousand seven hundred **gold** shekels, besides the moon-shaped ornaments and the eardrops and the garments of **wool dyed reddish purple** that were upon the kings of Midian and besides the necklaces that were on the necks of the camels. (**Judges 8:26**)
- So he returned the silver to his mother, and his mother took two hundred silver pieces and gave them to the silversmith. And he went making a carved image and a molten statue, and it got to be in Micah's house. (**Judges 17:4**)
- There are those who are lavishing out the **gold** from the purse, and with the scale beam they weigh out the silver. They hire a **metalworker**, and he makes it into a god. They prostrate themselves, yes, they bow down. (**Isaiah 46:6**)

- **Linen in various colors from Egypt your cloth expanse happened to be, in order for it to serve as your sail. Blue thread and wool dyed reddish purple from the islands of Elishah are what your deck covering proved to be. (Ezekiel 27:7)**
- **Tarshish was your merchant because of the abundance of all sorts of valuable things. For its silver, iron, tin and lead, your stores were given. (Ezekiel 27:12)**
- **And now they commit additional sin and make for themselves a molten statue from their silver, idols according to their own understanding, the work of craftsmen, all of it. To them they are saying, Let the sacrificers who are men kiss mere calves. (Hosea 13:2)**
- **And Jonah proceeded to get up and run away to Tarshish from before Yehowah, and he finally came down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid its fare and went down into it, in order to go with them to Tarshish from before Yehowah. (Jonah 1:3)**
