

**Jeremiah 16:20** **Can earthling man make for himself gods when they are no gods?**

[14] - References:

- Their idols are silver and gold, the work of the hands of earthling man. (**Psalms 115:4**)
- And there was a consigning of their gods to the fire, because they were no gods, but the workmanship of man's hands, wood and stone, so that they destroyed them. (**Isaiah 37:19**)
- Also, you behold and hear how not only in Ephesus but in nearly all the district of Asia this Paul has persuaded a considerable crowd and turned them to another opinion, saying that the ones that are made by hands are not gods. (**Acts of Apostles 19:26**)
- Has a nation exchanged gods, even for those that are no gods? But my own people have exchanged my glory for what can bring no benefit. (**Jeremiah 2:11**)
- While they of their own accord kept begging us with much entreaty for the privilege of kindly giving and for a share in the ministry destined for the holy ones. (**2 Corinthians 8:4**)
- Nevertheless, when you did not know God, then it was that you slaved for those who by nature are not gods. (**Galatians 4:8**)
- You men must not say; A conspiracy! Respecting all that of which this people keep saying; A conspiracy! And the object of their fear you men must not fear, nor must you tremble at it. (**Isaiah 8:12**)
- Will it not be that just as I shall have done to Samaria and to her valueless gods, even so I shall do to Jerusalem and to her idols? (**Isaiah 10:11**)
- And it occurred that it was seen that Moab was made weary upon the high place, and he came to his sanctuary to pray, and he could not accomplish anything. (**Isaiah 16:12**)
- And the spirit of Egypt must become bewildered in the midst of it, and I shall confuse its own counsel. And they will be certain to resort to the valueless gods and to the charmers and to the

**spirit mediums and to the professional foretellers of events.  
(Isaiah 19:3)**

- **Tell the things that are to come afterward, that we may know that **you** are **gods**. Yes, **you** ought to do good or do bad, that we may gaze about and see it at the same time. (Isaiah 41:23)**
- **This is what Yehowah has said, the King of Israel and the Repurchaser of him, Yehowah of armies, I am the first and I am the last, and besides me there is no God. (Isaiah 44:6)**
- **And from time long ago none have heard, nor have any given ear, nor has an eye itself seen a God, except you, that acts for the one that keeps in expectation of him. (Isaiah 64:4)**
- **Now concerning the eating of foods offered to idols, we know that an idol is nothing in the world, and that there is no God but one. (1 Corinthians 8:4)**
